



Special Insert on Children's Pastor

Bret Thorson

Bret Thorson knows children...lots of children! On any given Sunday, at least 100 children are in his midst. If you have been a part of the hustle and bustle of the Sunday School happenings, you have seen Bret. Being a children's pastor comes naturally for him and he is always happy to rave about the Higher GROUND Children's Ministry at Highline Christian Church!

Bret explains the purpose and mission of the children's ministry. "The Higher GROUND Children's Ministry is about growing children from the base of their spiritual relationship with Jesus to the peak of it for their age. Picture a mountain- the base of the mountain is the beginning. It is the largest part of the mountain and many people visit this part. As you trek up the mountain it gets steeper and smaller, fewer people go here and those who do have had to work at getting there. Now picture the peak or the summit of the mountain. The peak is a small area and only few make it this far, and those who do, have had to work really hard and often want to share that experience with someone else and do the trek again. The same is true of the Christian adventure. Many people have visited a church- "the base." Of those who visit some will stay and start growing in their faith, "mid-mountain." Of those who are growing in their faith only some will understand that the greatest joy only comes when we serve

God and serve others-"the peak." Those few who actually make it to "the peak" are often seen leading others up the mountain of their faith in hopes of leading them also to the higher ground."

Bret has such a dedication and enthusiasm for his

work with children- it is a vital reason for why he does what he does. Oh...the greatest moments of his Ministry! "To understand my greatest moments in ministry one needs to understand one of my greatest passions: sharing the Gospel with children so they can understand. Along with that passion is the understanding that it's not I who changes a child, but the Holy Spirit working in them."

"Early in my ministry I had a small group of kids, but they had a hunger for learning so I started writing devotions for them to use to study with. I considered this a great time because one student continued to push me every week for more to learn and another student was quoted as saying on a holiday, 'I need to go to a quiet place so I can do my devotions.' To this day both students have a healthy study habit of God's Word. Later in the ministry there was a boy who wanted to live for Jesus but he had some questions that were stopping him from making the decision. One night at a retreat at about 1:00 in the morning he finally asked his question and after hearing the answer he responded, 'I get it now! Ok, I'm ready to be baptized. I want to live for Jesus.' His behavior and attitude toward life completely changed and he is a growing student today."

Then, there was that family night of worship, prayer and fun with Youth Pastor, Chad! "It was our fall kick off to the school year ministries. The event was well attended, but more than that I believe families were challenged to grow. It was an amazing night and I look forward to another time when we can come together as families and have fun together as we worship and serve our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

Bret has been a familiar face at Highline Christian Church for quite some time now. He can relate to 7th graders coming to church, because he started



attending Highline Christian Church at this age, and was actively involved in the youth group through high school. As a high school student, he was involved in counseling at children's camps and eventually he began teaching the 3rd and 4th grade class. He left Highline for a period of time while attending school and had the opportunity to learn about children's ministry from other children's ministers. He credits God with working in amazing ways to bring him back to the church. Not just any church, but this one- the one he grew up in and where he gave his life to the Lord.

Bret graduated from college in June of 1997 and started working at Highline part-time as the Children's Pastor in September of 1997. The eldership was impressed with what God was doing through the part-time ministry and offered him a full-time position, effective January 1st, 1998. Since then, Bret shares, "It has been one blessing after another and now after some time has passed, it is a joy to see students who were in the children's ministry now serving in their own ministries."

There are people Bret admires- ones who have their special places in his life. First, there is his wife, Davi. "I love and admire Davi for the way she lives each day to the fullest looking for ways to serve God in all she does. She is my greatest support and my greatest critic. She challenges me to be a better person in all I do and to do my ministry better and always look for better ways of doing what we do in the ministry."

Then, Patti Bertelson and Nancy Waner come to mind. "I admire these two wonderful women of the faith for their dedication to their own children's ministries. They have both been involved in children's ministry much longer than I and still have a passion to share God's love with children. I have learned a great deal from each of them and hope their churches know what a blessing they have in each of them."

Of course, Pastor Tim is recognized. "As the Senior Pastor of Highline and my day-to-day boss, he has set an example of godly leadership which I have learned from. I also admire him for his

willingness to take time to listen and share with me when I just drop in for an unscheduled visit. He and his wife have been strong role models for me and have been a real blessing to both my wife and me. I believe much of what is happening at Highline is due to the great team of staff God has blessed us with- of which Pastor Tim is the leader."

Bret has his own philosophy about children. "Children today long for affection, they want to belong, and they want to know there are boundaries and what the boundaries are. I believe the children who attend Higher Ground Children's Ministry activities enjoy them because it is a safe place for them to belong where they are encouraged and challenged to grow in academic abilities and more importantly, spiritually."

Bret believes that the future of the Higher Ground Children's Ministry has much to do with families. "Over the past eight years I have seen children change and grow but I have also seen children fall through the cracks. It hurts when I see teens who used to be in the children's ministry who now have nothing to do with the church for one reason or another. The question becomes what can we in the children's ministry do better to keep kids growing? The answer is to partner with their parents. No matter how much we love the kids, their parents will almost always have a greater impact on their lives than we can. To make use of the power of parents we need to partner with them in leading children in their faith. One way we are partnering with parents is to match the children's 11:00 a.m. lesson with the sermon the parents receive. I believe this joint venture between the staff of Highline and parents will have a huge impact on the families of Highline and on the faith of every child and youth who attend. What better way is there to share God's love with children than through their parents?"

Just what is the big deal about Children's Ministry at Highline? In one word...it's the KIDS!

UP FOR THE WORD

One of the songs we sing in the Children's Ministry is titled "Up For The Word." The song talks about getting excited about God's Word and getting into God's Word each day. This song describes a number of the kids who are involved in Trail Trekkers each week.


The first thing the kids do when they come to Trail Trekkers is look up different verses in their Bibles and read through them. After they have read their verses, they go to the memory verse area and work on memorizing God's Word. During lesson time the kids take turns reading the verses they looked up and more often than not, we do not have enough verses for the number of kids who want to read. How exciting it is for leaders to see the kids excited about reading God's Word.

One other thing about God's Word the Trail Trekkers have been excited about is the opportunity for them to earn their very own Bible. The kids receive points each week for bringing a Bible, memory verse cards, their Power Page, and for memorizing the Mighty Memory Verse. After earning 30 points the kids earn an NIV Adventure Bible of their own.


