

### What's Happening with the New Building?

#### A Successful (makeshift) First Service!

Through the prayers and long, hard work of A LOT of people we were able to hold Tom Barnes' memorial service in our new sanctuary. A special thanks goes to Burien City Building officials and Fire Marshall. They were willing to work with us to establish reasonable conditions for granting a temporary occupancy permit. The service was an exciting preview of what's to come! A lot of the components for the service were temporary or portable, but the wiring team also pulled about 20 wires that are permanent. (It's too bad they had to work until 5:00 A.M. to get it done though.) We even had some contractors help get the building ready. Our coordinator from the Local 32 Plumbers Union even worked half a day on general tasks just because he wanted to help.

Thanks to all who helped after the service to clean up, reassemble the sound and video systems back in our current sanctuary, and take down the 730 chairs.


## A Tribute to Tom Barnes

The pet food drive to benefit the Humane Society garnered over 40 pounds of cat/dog food, which has been delivered to their Bellevue facility (a no-kill location). Thank you everyone who contributed.

The Low Sugar Cookbook has successfully completed six bi-weekly newsletters. The seventh (and final) issue comes out early April, at which time the collection will be evaluated for consolidation into the cookbook to be made available to those interested.

We are continuing to collect for recycling...aluminum cans... collection barrels located in the Fellowship Hall, in support of missions.



Shoemaker Circle is a group of women who meet every third Wednesday (10:30 A.M.) in the Fellowship Hall and whose purpose is to support missions (currently, the aluminum can recycling); to support the Fellowship (annual bake/bazaar sale in November); and the pet food drive to benefit the Humane Society (community support project). The Low Sugar Cookbook project was designed to both encourage healthy living, and to support the Mission 2008 team through the sale of the collection.

### Sample Recipe

#### Pineapple/Lemon Pudding Pie Filling

1. Mix (1) pkg. sugar free lemon instant pudding and (1) can (20 oz) crushed pineapple
2. Fold in (1) cup sugar free whipped topping.
3. Chill (1) hour...may be used as pudding or pie filling



Suggested option: Place spoonfuls in ice cream cake cups—FREEZE—garnish with chopped nuts. Great for picnics or after school treats!

## Chile Missions Trip Meeting







### Every Sunday is a Little Easter...

Beginning with the first Easter, the celebration of the Resurrection has been the focus of Christian worship. Because the early disciples were Jews they would have observed the Sabbath on Saturday. However, the first day of the week became the day for Christian worship. It was known as the Lord's Day, the day of Resurrection. Our weekly Sunday worship is a celebration of Jesus' resurrected presence with us - a little Easter each week.

The season of Lent is 40 days long, not counting Sundays. The actual number of days from Lent's start on Ash Wednesday to (but not including) Easter Sunday is 46 days. But because the church sees every Sunday as a mini-Easter celebrating Christ's resurrection, the six Sundays that occur during those 46 days are not counted as part of Lent.


### APRIL ALL CHURCH MEMORY VERSE






