Ensenada, Here We Come! April 6-12, 2008

Thank you so much for your continued support over the past year as we have planned, fund-raised, and prepared for this mission trip. The time has finally come for us to step out in faith and head to Ensenada, Mexico. We will be traveling to the Ensenada Outreach Center (EOC) which is part of YUGO Ministries to **build a home for a family in need and run a Vacation Bible School** in one of the local churches. We are excited to have the opportunity to serve the Lord in this way and are looking forward to doing ministry together as a family while we are there.

The kids have been working hard to learn the VBS songs in Spanish as well as learn how to lead small groups of kids in Mexico to build their lesson/craft. We are very fortunate to have David Lobo-Guerrero, my father-in-law, traveling with us to teach the Bible lessons. The first day of VBS we teach about creation and how each of the kids are special creations made by God. The craft is a decorated mirror they can hang in their home when they are done. It is a reminder of how fearfully and wonderfully made they are. The second day of VBS is about the crucifixion of Jesus to pay the price for our sins. It is called the bitter cross. Through the lesson we make a cross of nails and wire, with each wrap of the wire symbolizing part of the story. The last day of VBS we will combine



the victory we have in Jesus with the need to share His wonderful story. We will be making a beaded cross using the gospel colors, giving the kids a tool to share about God's love. We are looking forward to having lots of fun singing and playing with the kids at VBS.

The **construction** site will be a new adventure for us, but we have a great team of people who are not afraid to get dirty. Again, God has blessed us with another Spanish speaker for the construction site in Luis Hernandez. With Luis able to help us communicate with the family, the YUGO rep to help guide us build, and the servants hearts of the rest of the team we should be able to complete the home in a God-honoring way.

Prayer support: Many of you have signed up to be our prayer partners and we thank you in advance for your support. We know we are joining God in His work in Ensenada and ask you to pray for our hearts to be sensitive to follow Him. Following (see page 2) is a simplified itinerary with some prayer ideas for each day. Again, thank all of you so much for your support and for this opportunity to go on this mission trip.

For graduates of TOUCH 1, TOUCH 2 will be offered on April 12th 9 A.M.-noon

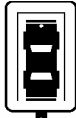
For graduates of TOUCH 2, TOUCH 3 will be offered on April 28th 6 P.M.-9 P.M.

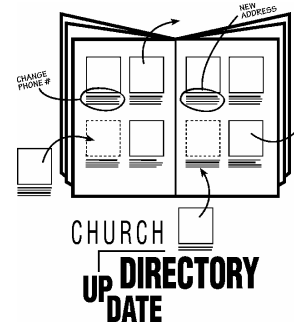

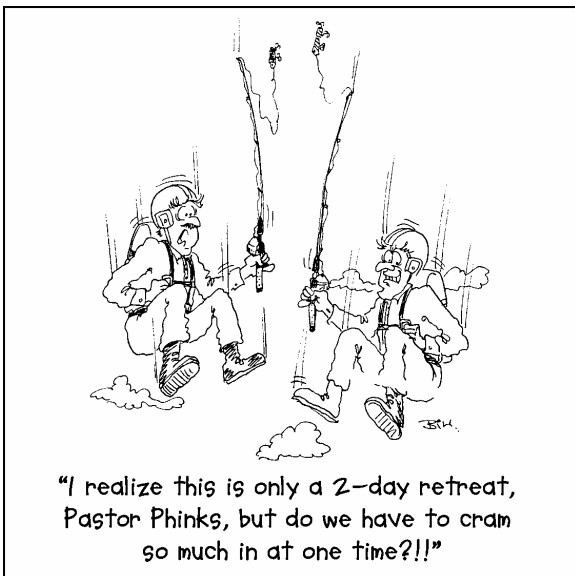
Prevent a Stroke in as Little as 10 Minutes!

Life Line Screening will be performing a day of preventative health screenings at *Burien Elk's Lodge #2143* on *Wednesday, June 4, 2008*.

The tests offered include a state-of-the-art ultrasound screening of the carotid arteries in the neck (most strokes are linked to plaque build-up in these arteries), another ultrasound screening of the abdominal aortic aneurysm (ruptured AAA's have a 85-94% mortality rate and present little or no signs), a third test which screens for plaque build-up in the arteries of the legs (a strong indicator of coronary heart disease) and a fourth bone density test which screens for signs of osteoporosis.

“Why not just go to my doctor for these tests?” you may ask. The answer, although surprising, is that your physician typically cannot order these tests without clear evidence of symptoms. Ironically, most people who suffer a stroke or abdominal aneurysm never show any signs that a major medical catastrophe is about to occur.

These painless, non-invasive tests take about 10 minutes each and are offered for just \$45 each (all four for \$129). **YOU MUST PRE-REGISTER** by calling 1-800-324-1851

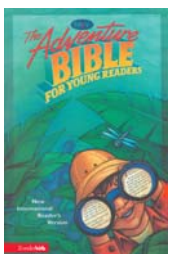

There are many new faces in the Early Childhood Ministry! Thank you to all who have filled out paperwork to begin serving!

Dropping off young children at church can be a little tough. Many children face a bit of anxiety when they are dropped off in a class. To help your child feel more comfortable, be sure to introduce him or her to the teachers in the room. Reassure your child that you love him or her and will be coming back right after church service. It is helpful to say goodbye and then leave. One goodbye is a lot easier on your child. It can be scary to not know if you are staying or going. Many children may cry for a few minutes, then settle down to play. If your child does not settle down

after 10 minutes, we will page you. If your child has a tough time adjusting to the room, it is also helpful to come back and sign him or her out promptly after service is over. We want all children to feel that church is a fun and safe place.

Spring is coming and the flowers are blooming. We have been learning during the 10:40 service about being rooted in God. We grow closer to God by reading the Bible, praying, and coming to church. The children enjoyed looking at the roots of a flower. Use opportunities when you and your child see a plant or a tree to point out how we can be rooted in God.
