## APRIL--OUCH!

April and October are two months that cause some people to shutter. Both months are "tax months." Real estate taxes on our homes and other properties are due and payable, and, in April, Federal income taxes are due. These taxes are just the tip of the iceberg. Other taxes include; sales tax, utility tax, and in some states, a state income tax.

There are other taxes that are labeled "Fees." We have very little to say about taxes and very little control over taxes. An old saying states, "The only sure thing in life, are death and taxes." Some taxes are paid through withholding taxes on our salaries. In some situations real estate taxes are paid through mortgage payments. Paying taxes is not a choice; we are forced to pay them.

No matter which form of taxes we are talking about, they all affect our lives, our thinking, and how we consider our "money." In our culture we no longer "trade" or "barter" for goods or services. Our culture is based on currency (money).

Why write about taxes? Taxes require "money" and "money" is one of the central, controlling influences in people's lives. The Apostle Paul stated in First Timothy 6:12 that "the love of money is the root of evil." Paul's emphasis was on the words "love of" money. The very mention of "money" will often strike a sore nerve in some people's thinking.

Some churches and church leaders shy away from the subject of "money". Have you ever heard anyone say; "All the church is interested in is my money." **AT HIGHLINE CHRISTIAN CHURCH THIS IS NOT TRUE.** In our Sunday bulletin, the following statement is clearly stated." Please do not feel obligated to participate in the offering. It is for those who consider Highline Christian Church their church home." The emphasis in Highline Christian Church is on the "individual" and on the fact that God is concerned about the total commitment of every one. Since money "is a

central factor" in our lives, it cannot be left out of our relationship with God.

The Elders of Highline Christian Church published a well thought out and logically set forth document stating that God is interested in individuals, their time (lives), their talent, and their treasure. The document is based on the Bible and is easy to read and understand.



During the worship services there is a time titled "Ministry Moment." An individual talks about the activities and concerns of Highline Christian Church's program. This gives everyone an opportunity to know and appreciate what is taking place in Highline


here in Highline Christian Church.

# Reformed Reflections

Cardinal Jorge Bergoglio of Argentina was elected as the 266th Pope on March 13<sup>th</sup>. He took the title of Francis I- reportedly in honor of St. Francis of Assisi. He is the first non-European Pope in over 1200 years! With all the driving secular media coverage, what are we as Christians to think about this momentous occasion?

Among his introductory comments, The *New York Times* reported that as he blessed the faithful, Francis asked the audience in Italian to “pray for me, and we’ll see each other soon.” This is certainly commendable and in line with the injunction given in 1 Timothy 2:1-2, “*Therefore I exhort first of all that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men, for kings and all who are in authority, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence.*” We can and should pray for all men- even the Pope. He has taken conservative stances with regards to his opposition to both abortion and same-sex marriage. We would generally agree with him in these important matters. These are but some of the common ground we hold. Despite this, there are other significant lines of demarcation from Roman Catholicism going back to the Reformation. Here are, briefly, two continuing theological issues that separate us:

## The Authority of Scripture

One of the major conflicts of the Reformation was the battle over *Sola Scriptura* versus *Sola Ecclesia*. *Sola Scriptura*’s basic tenet is the belief that Scripture is the final and only infallible authority for the Christian in all matters of faith and practice. One’s view on this significant doctrine plays out into other related theological issues.

The Westminster Confession of Faith echoes this in stating: The authority of the Holy Scripture, for

which it ought to be believed, and obeyed, dependeth not upon the testimony of any man, or Church; but wholly upon God (who is truth itself) the author thereof: and therefore it is to be received, because it is the Word of God. ( 2 Pet. 1:19,21; 2 Tim. 3:16; 1 Jn 5:9; 1Th 2:13) Here at Highline, in our *What We Believe*, we hold that the Bible is the inspired, infallible, inerrant, Word of God and is authoritative for all matters of Christian faith and practice. Roman Catholics on the other hand hold to *Sola Ecclesia*. This is the belief that Tradition, represented by the magisterial authority of the Roman Catholic Church, is infallible and equal to Scripture as a basis for doctrine; it is the final authority in all matters of faith and practice since it must define and interpret scripture. Rome has two sources of authority; the Church *and* scripture. Scripture in essence takes a subordinate role to the Church in that it must be interpreted by Rome to give it’s meaning! This is still the official position of the Roman Catholic Church.

## Justification By Grace Alone

The predominant view held by Protestants is that we are justified by faith alone- *Sola Fide*. The Westminster Confession states that, “Faith, thus receiving and resting on Christ and His righteousness, is the alone instrument of justification; yet is it not alone in the person justified, but is ever accompanied with all other saving graces, and is no dead faith, but worketh by love.”(John 1:12; Rom. 3:28; Rom. 5:1; James 2:17,22,26; Gal. 5:6)

The Roman Catholic response to the Reformers (referred to as the Counter-Reformation) was delivered at the Council of Trent (1545-1563), the declarations of which are still in force! The Roman Catholic Church formally condemned the biblical doctrine of faith alone and grace alone.

Fast-forward to the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. Rome has continued to deny that salvation is by grace alone through Christ’s atonement alone through faith alone without works or sacraments. Consider the

following statements of the authoritative Vatican II Council of the mid-1960s, called by Pope John Paul XXIII and attended by more than 2,400 Catholic bishops--

"For it is the liturgy through which, especially in the divine sacrifice of the Eucharist, 'the work of our redemption is accomplished,' and it is through the liturgy, especially, that the faithful are enabled to express in their lives and manifest to others the mystery of Christ and the real nature of the true Church" (Vatican II, Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Introduction, para. 2).

"As often as the sacrifice of the cross by which 'Christ our Pasch is sacrificed' (1 Cor. 5:7) is celebrated on the altar, the work of our redemption is carried out" (Vatican II, Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, Chapter 1, 3, p. 324).

"... [Christ] also willed that the work of salvation which they preached should be set in train through the sacrifice and sacraments, around which the entire liturgical [ritualistic] life revolves. Thus by Baptism men are grafted into the paschal mystery of Christ. ... They receive the spirit of adoption as sons" (Vatican II, Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Chap. 1, I, 5,6, pp. 23-24).


This is still the official position of the Roman Catholic Church.

So, what are we to make of this? I think it far too soon to make any meaningful assessment of Pope Francis. I certainly hope... and pray for God's guidance for him. But, we know very little of his actual core beliefs-or his relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ! The Core issue for me is what does the scripture say? (Rom. 4:3). This boils down to 1 Cor. 2:5, "...that your faith should not be in the wisdom of men but in the power of God." Our faith or hope should not rest upon a man or his institution, but in God, our Savior, Who alone is wise, Be glory and majesty, Dominion and power, both now and forever." Amen. The Reformation continues...
