

It is a fact that people who read the Bible and apply its message to their lives, have been transformed. Their lives have changed. They view and approach life differently, and they relate to people around them in a different, more loving way. The people who read and apply the Bible message are not perfect, but they are seeking to know God, they have committed themselves to Him, and they are becoming more perfect. To know God and to become more Christ like, we need to read and study and apply the Bible message to our lives.


An author stated in his book that he deliberately set out to read the whole Bible and timed his reading. He read the complete Bible in 72 hours. That averages out to 12 minutes per day to read the whole Bible in a year. How much time should we set aside to read the Bible? The necessary time will vary from individual to individual. We are all different from each other. Each individual must decide for themselves how much time to set aside to read and study the Bible. It is important to take the time to read, study, and then apply the Bible message to our daily lives.

Pastor Tim highly recommends and encourages each person to daily read their Bible. Bible reading guides are available to assist and guide you. The following are 2 resources for a Bible Reading Plan:


