

mission and church projects. Bring a sandwich with you; relishes and dessert are provided. See Georgia Henney with questions.




Seniors' Potluck Planned

Women in Touch Spotlight: Dyan Lauer

What brought you to HCC?

I was talking to my neighbor about how I was looking for a church family. Especially a place that had a great children's ministry program, and she recommended checking out HCC. Her husband's family had been a member here for many years. We found exactly what we were looking for when we arrived here, and have been coming ever since!

How did you come to know the Lord?

I was raised in a Christian home, so I have always been taught about God and his Son, but it wasn't until I was an adult, and a mother before I really truly GOT IT. There were a lot of emotions during my husband's first deployment, it was hard staying home with our children and feeling so alone. At that time I had 2 kids, they were 2 years, and a newborn of 2 weeks old when he left...and I was exhausted through and through. It was during this time, and through two women of God at my previous church, I was reminded of God's love for me. I found that in him I would never feel lonely and that if I asked, he would always bring me peace.

Tell us about your family?

I have been married almost 8 years this February! My husband Daniel is an Army reservist and a full time Firefighter. We have 3 amazing children who I find so much joy in. Isabella is 6, Jackson is 4, and Addison is 2! We are blessed to be surrounded by both mine and my husband's parents and they dote on our children regularly. Without their support I don't know how we would keep everything a float.

What do you do like to do for fun?

When I get the chance, I love to read. A good book and a cup of hot coffee is definitely my happy place. And ballet! I love to dance, though that is something I haven't been able to squish into our family schedule recently.

What's your favorite restaurant?

I'm a sucker for a good cheeseburger, so Red Robin is definitely a family favorite!

What's the farthest you have been from home?

Kuwait. When I was in the Air Force many years ago I was an Air Evac medic; we flew back and forth from Kuwait to D.C. many times.

What book other than the Bible are you currently reading?

I'm reading a beautiful story called "Two from Galilee" by Marjorie Holmes. It is a fictional book that has Bible fact, interwoven with the author's take on how she pictured Mary, Joseph and Jesus as people. 




Resources I'm Enjoying


