Thank you for helping to maintain and improve the Highline Christian Church facility.

A thank you to close the current year or to start the new one. Many thanks to all who have stepped up during 2015 to improve the facility here at Highline Christian Church. It would take the HUB list to list you all. We have a better facility because of your willingness to help. We have had far more people volunteer their time and energy to do routine maintenance, repairs and improvements. Because of the help of several individuals we have been blessed by additional furnishings and carpet donated to HCC by local companies.

Major projects that have been worked on during 2015 are the re-carpeting of most of the South Building (including ALL the stairwells), transforming the old library and "catch all" area in the South Building into a wonderful "Lodge" meeting area for the 1st- 6th grade children, in the Fall we upgraded the furnishings in our Atrium, and most recently we have been able to replace chairs and tables in the adult classrooms in the North Building. Because of your efforts the materials and labor costs were minimal.

Most of these projects were completed by you..... Each Monday 6-10 of you show up and volunteer your abilities and talents to bless Highline.... At the work parties (the third Saturday of each month) 10-20 of you show up to do whatever needs doing to improve our facility. Just in those two activities **HCC attenders are donating well over 1600 labor hours a year**. On top of this, we have members maintaining the landscape, blowing off the parking lot, installing and maintaining lights and sound equipment and..... much, much more. We are BLESSED. The ministry of reaching people with the saving message of JESUS CHRIST is furthered by your efforts. May God continue to bless you, HCC, and our ministry in this coming year.

2016 will bring challenges yet unknown... We do have a few projects already planned (to mention a few- finish the carpeting in the South Building, re-carpet the North Building Atrium, create storage closets in the South Building in at least two areas, convert the old family mail box room to The Community Room, create a new room in the Great Room area and update the lighting in the parking lot). We can always use your talents and energy to help accomplish these current and future projects. ALL are welcome!

We pray that you all enjoyed the mission trip that took place in the Northwest corner of our parking lot on December 11 and 12.






Christmas Tree Stand Report

Reformed Reflections: The Resolutions of Jonathan Edwards

That time of year is upon us. Most of us attempt resolutions of various sorts. We love them or we hate them. We make them and we break them.

Instead of offering a list of specific New-Year resolutions, I thought I'd provide a historical look back at America's renowned Pastor-theologian and some of his general life-guiding resolutions. I was reminded of them as I reflected back on this year and looked forward to 2016. (Edwards penned 70, but for the sake of brevity I will only list the first 10). Along with a brief background here they are.

During his preparation for the ministry, his residence in New York, and his subsequent residence in his father's house, he formed a series of resolutions, to the number of seventy, intended obviously for himself alone, to regulate his own heart and life, but fitted also, from their Christian simplicity and spiritual-mindedness, to be eminently useful to others.

It should be remembered they were all written before he was twenty years of age. As he was wholly averse to all profession and ostentation; and as these resolutions themselves were plainly intended for no other eye than his own, except the eye that is omniscient; they may be justly considered as the basis of his conduct and character, the plan by which he governed the secret as well as the publick(sic) actions of his life. As such they will deeply interest the reader, not only as they unfold the inmost mind of their author, but as they also show, in a manner most striking and convincing to the conscience, what is the true foundation of great and distinguished excellence.¹ (Edited and abbreviated)

"Being sensible that I am unable to do any thing without God's help, I do humbly entreat him, by his grace, to enable me to keep these Resolutions, so far as they are agreeable to his will, for Christ's sake. Remember to read over these Resolutions once a week.²

1. Resolved that I will do all I think or say to the glory of God and not to take into consideration my own comfort, profit or pleasure.

2. Resolved if ever I shall fall and grow dull so as to neglect to keep any of these resolutions, I shall repent when I come to my senses again.
3. Resolved never to lose one moment of time but use it to the most profitable way I can.
4. Resolved to live with all my might.
5. Resolved never to do anything which I should be afraid to do if it were my last hour of my life or before the last trumpet blew.
6. Resolved to act in word and deed as if nobody had been so vile as I to live as if I had committed the same sins or had the same infirmities or failings as others to confess my own sins and miser to God when I am prone to look on shame at others.
7. Resolved to think much on the brevity and how short ones life is. Psalm 90:17, *Teach me to number my days that I may apply my heart to wisdom.*
8. Resolved when I feel pain or the least of discomfort to think of the pains of martyrdom - the torments of Hell.
9. Resolved if I see a problem to try to solve it or if someone need help to help them.
10. Resolved if I do help to never become proud or puffed up or seek the credit (glory).

Such were the excellent Resolutions formed by Jonathan Edwards at an early period of life, and which in succeeding years were regarded by him, not as unimportant records, but as containing the great principles of the spiritual life.³

May we be similarly challenged to meditate and pray on these as our own.


He sent His Son Jesus the Christ to earth to clearly demonstrate and show us God so we could establish a saving relationship with Him.






Big God Story!

The Early Childhood program uses an amazing curriculum to teach the children at Highline. Part of the lesson has a time line. Each week we add a picture of a person that represents the lesson. This shows the children how the Bible is linked together to make one story. All of December, we looked at Jesus. As we studied the Nativity story, we gained a glimpse of God's plan from the beginning of creation. We studied how we need a Savior from the story of Adam and Eve on the week we talked about Jesus being born. There is a need for people to help serve in the Early Childhood area as an "on call" substitute. If you could help serve in that capacity, please talk to Katie Taylor.


