


## News from Shoemaker Circle

Shoemaker circle will meet Wednesday June 8 at 11 A.M. in the Fellowship Hall then travel via church van to **South Seattle Community College** for our annual end-of-fiscal-year trip. This will be the last meeting before taking the summer off. We will be having lunch at SSCC in the Alhadeef Room where culinary students and staff provide experience and good food to the general public. Reservations are requested. After lunch we will be going to the nearly completed **Seattle Chinese Garden**, across from SSCC, and now open to the general public. Although not wheelchair accessible, this exhibit features unique pavilions, gardens and ponds with compacted gravel pathways. We will be escorted by a docent. The tour includes an opening video presentation and layout plans. Arboretum (and benches) and paved areas, next door, before we all return to the church building around 3 P.M.

Shoemaker Circle continues to collect aluminum cans for recycling as a fundraiser in support of missions. Currently we are regularly supporting **Bread of Life Mission** in downtown Seattle. Collection tubs for the cans are located in the South Building, Fellowship Hall. # Highline Christian Church – Giving Statement

## Introduction

About a year ago, the Elders undertook the task of seeking to understand what the Bible teaches us about giving. It wasn't an easy task, but one we realized needed to be done. We learned many things about giving and stewardship and have attempted to sum up those studies in this document. If you have any comments or questions, you may direct them to the Elders e-mail box ([elders@highlinechristian.org](mailto:elders@highlinechristian.org)) or by written inquiry in the church office mailbox.

## Background

The Old Testament baseline of stewardship was the tithe (10%) of all of one's resources and was to be given for God's use through the local synagogue. Old Testament Jews typically gave more than the baseline through their periodic feasts and annual required sacrifices.

The Old Testament tithe is not taught by Jesus nor the Apostles in the New Testament. Instead, they teach about the stewardship of one's whole life encompassing the talents and financial blessings God has bestowed on each of us.

Since Jesus strengthened many Old Testament commands, many Christians today continue to practice stewardship by returning to God 10% or more of their income to God through their local church and return additional amounts through other God-honoring charities and ministries.

The Elders of Highline Christian Church, after much prayer, study, and discussion, have developed the following statement regarding the topic of Stewardship:

## The Prayer Closet

There's a little booklet that's been around for a long time. It was compiled from a collection of conversations with and letters written by a monk by the name of Brother Lawrence in the 1600's. I first read the booklet in my early 20's and its thoughts have challenged me from then on. This booklet is called The Practice of the Presence of God. You can download a free copy off the internet, if you wish ([www.practicegodspresence.com/brotherlawrence/index.html](http://www.practicegodspresence.com/brotherlawrence/index.html)).

This booklet discusses Brother Lawrence's practice of living through every day with his mind focused on the Lord. Colossians 3:17 reminds us, "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him."

Whatever Brother Lawrence did, he did unto the Lord. Whether it was peeling potatoes, hoeing the garden, or cleaning the monastery, he did all his tasks with his thoughts and prayers focused on the Lord. He talked with the Lord about everything he went through and everything that came to his mind. No task too insignificant and no service beneath God's notice, but all was sacred when done unto the Lord. Nothing was too mundane to chat about with the Lord. Whether it was the state of the weather or the state of his heart, the Lord heard about it all! He called it "practicing" because he confessed he wasn't too good at it in the beginning, but with continued effort, he grew better at it throughout the 40 years he spent as a monk. It was his life-long quest. When he found his thoughts wandering, he'd rein them in. When he forgot, he'd start again. He found the practice became more and more a part of him and he

forgot less as time went by. Yet he never believed he had fully arrived to full maturity in this practice.

Practicing the presence of God is an excellent place to start in our own prayer journey. I Thessalonians 5:17 instructs us to "Pray without ceasing." One of my favorite places to talk with the Lord is in the car, on the way to and from work. The Lord is my passenger. Sometimes I envision Him sitting in the seat beside me--in those moments when I feel the need for a flesh and blood confidant. I am

reminded at such a time that I have a flesh and blood Savior who's able to help me and asks me to come share all my burdens with Him. Frances Gardner Hunter found her bathtub to be her haven. One precious brother calls his truck cab his house of prayer. My sister-in-law encouraged me to "pray over every item" when she gave me an iron as a bridal shower gift. As we start associating more and

more tasks in our lives as time to chit-chat with God, the more we are "practicing the presence of God."




