## **I'M SO GRATEFUL FOR STEPHEN MINISTRY!**

By a man who received care from a Stephen Minister

**F**ourteen months ago, I was at a point where I needed someone to talk to about the struggles in my life. My pastor recommended I consider meeting with a Stephen Minister—another man, trained as a caregiver, who would walk with me during this difficult time. Trusting someone with personal information about my life was something I feared at first, but my pastor reassured me that everything was confidential, so I agreed to give it a try. I'm so glad I did!

Soon after meeting my Stephen Minister, I quickly sensed I could trust him. Part of that trust came from knowing he was trained to help people through their problems. He made me feel comfortable by not prying for information, but instead just letting me share what was on my mind. Any questions he did ask fit our conversation appropriately. Probably the best thing he did for me was not judging me for my past decisions; rather, he was there to help me move forward.

I think another significant trust-building factor was being able to talk with someone who was not in my regular circle of friends. My friends certainly continued to have a very important place in my life, but I also needed someone who could see me objectively. That helped make it easier to share personal parts of my life. Also, knowing my Stephen Minister would be there for me "next week" (we usually met for an hour each week) gave me confidence.

### What is Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Ministry is a way congregations can provide high-quality care and outreach to hurting people in the congregation and community. Stephen Ministers are congregation members who have gone through 50 hours of training to provide one-to-one, Christ-centered care. Each Stephen Minister is matched with a hurting person—men are paired with men, women with women—and meets weekly with that person to listen, care, pray, and encourage. Stephen Ministers care for those dealing with grief, divorce, job loss, hospitalization, financial struggles, loneliness, convalescence, terminal illness, and many other life difficulties.

## Touching the World with Hope

As we enter another year of serving Christ the World Outreach Committee is excited that Highline is partnering with five new mission works.

**Asian Children's Mission** is a small mission that serves children and their families in the Southeast Asian nation of Myanmar, also known as Burma. ACM was born out of the deep desire to serve the most vulnerable children in this Southeast Asian country.



**Pinehaven Christian Children's Ranch** is a residential, year-round program aimed at providing a stable, controlled, secure environment in which young people can reach the potential that God has placed within them.



**Pioneer Bible Translators** bridges the gap between the church and the Bibleless peoples around the world. Our team is composed of Bible translators, literacy evangelists, church planters and a variety of support personnel transforming lives through God's Word in every language.

**Roots & Wings Ministries** works in Mazatlán, Mexico to provide impoverished families with healthy and affordable childcare for children who have no one to care for them while their parents are at work. Roots & Wings' mission is to assist these children in their physical, mental and spiritual development by providing safe and nurturing daytime care, food, clothing, medical and educational assistance, biblical counsel and unconditional love.



**The Crescent Project** is a mission to inspire, equip and serve the Church to reach Muslims with the Gospel of Christ for the Glory of God. It is their vision to see a day when fear is replaced with love and millions of Christians are actively sharing the truth of Christ with millions of Muslims for the glory of God. They do this through prayer, training and local outreach. Most Muslim ministries have focused on sending full-time missionaries overseas to Muslim countries. Crescent Project has used an entirely different approach: train the local church to reach out to the Muslims in the community. Since 1993, Crescent Project instructors have trained over 15,000 Christians throughout North America.

## Fellowship-Expression of God's Love

This is the first in a series of articles on the worship service at Highline Christian Church. A visitor or a new member of the church may be a little confused or bewildered by the different elements in the worship service. If those individuals attended or were members of other churches, they may question why Highline Christian Church conducts their worship service in the manner it does. Over the years Highline Christian Church has carefully and prayerfully, organized and conducted the service in its current form.

The central reason for the arrangement and parts of the worship service is found in the Book of Acts and the Epistles (letters) and reflects an understanding of Jesus teachings centered on the Great Commission. (Mathew 28:18 - 20.) Highline Christian Church's worship service is developed to meet the needs of its members. We can thank God for other churches that are meeting other people's needs.

One of the first main elements a person encounters when coming to Highline, is "Christian Fellowship." As you approach the church you will see several individuals near the doors. At most worship services one of those individuals will be Pastor Tim Knight. He will greet you and welcome you to the service. Several other people with name badges who are passing out bulletins will also welcome you. As you enter the Atrium you will see people talking, shaking hands, and in some cases exchanging hugs. Hugs are an expression of affection and joy between members of the Christian "Family." Other people will be circulating and introducing themselves to visitors and to people they do not know.

The service begins with a song and then everyone is invited to greet the people around them. Some people may be startled by seeing people greet and hug each other. This again is an expression of love and affection for one another and is the result of pure joy expressed between members of a loving Christian family. All of this is an expression of

Christian Fellowship and may seem strange to those who are from a church background that worship with a more formalized service.

The Bible states clearly that God's Spirit is living within each Christian follower. As we come together, God's Spirit is in our midst drawing us together in our worship of God. This is Fellowship with God. Fellowship can also be a time of sharing, a time of strengthening ourselves and our fellow Christians. Does this happen at Highline? Have you experienced it?



A short time after my wife went to be with God, I was in a worship service and having a difficult time. After 60 years of worshipping together, listening to her singing in her sweet alto, and having her there to talk to and share, I was alone. As I bowed my head in agony, I felt a hand on my shoulder. I placed my hand over the comforting hand and looked around at a young lady sitting behind me with her parents. The compassionate touch of the young lady's hand gave me strength to face that day and the days ahead.

Recently she attended worship services with her husband and her family. We hugged each other as we remembered that expression of loving concern and encouragement we had shared together. This was a wonderful illustration of loving Christian Fellowship. Does this happen often at Highline Christian Church? Absolutely yes, over and over. Fellowship is an important part of the worship service at Highline Christian Church. Wonderful things can happen to you and for you as we fellowship together in our worshipping of God. Yes, fellowship in Highline Christian Church's worship service is important. Get to know your fellow Christian families, greet each other and get acquainted with visitors and other people you don't know. Everyone benefits as we fellowship together at our worship services.

**Have you considered a trip to Mount St. Helens?**


- WHO? Anyone who wants to see God’s handy work.
