## Special Insert on Youth Pastor

Chad Schnathorst

**A**t Highline Christian Church, we like to think we have the BEST Youth Pastor! Actually we do...the experts will tell you this. And just who are the “experts?” The experts are the teens- the ones who are a part of the “HYM”- Hardcore Youth Ministry at Highline.

If you are a parent, of a teen, you probably know Chad Schnathorst. For over three years, the Youth Pastor has blessed Highline with his magnificent creativity and love of youth and God. Teens listen to Chad because he has an obvious gift of connecting with them. He believes that all youth can be “hardcore,” and that the adolescent/teen years are probably some of the toughest times in a person’s life.

He reflects back to the beginning. “It hasn’t always been a smooth ride between the staff and the teens, but I believe that they have come to know that we care deeply about them, pray for them, and after awhile have come to respect each other. There is a good bunch of young people and I believe that each one of them has great potential! It also does me good to know that at least two of our young men are considering going into full-time ministry for themselves.”

Chad started getting involved in Youth Ministry under Bruce Lijegren, the Youth Pastor at Normandy Christian Church in the early 90’s. Having a younger brother in the Youth Group, Chad discovered he really enjoyed working with the other teens and the Youth Staff at Normandy Christian Church. Bruce encouraged Chad to give full-time Ministry a try, so he did just that! Chad made plans to return to school- which took a few years to save enough funds and he worked out/prayed about balancing a job/school schedule that would allow him to be successful at both. Looking back, he undoubtedly knows, “The Lord made it all work out according to His plan, which took a

little longer than I anticipated but here I am!”

Chad is sending a positive message to teens which involves his five key desires. The first of these is that youth come to know the Lord Jesus Christ as their

Personal Lord and Savior and to keep God number one in their lives. Mark 12:30, Romans 10:9-13. His wish is for youth to understand that love is the most powerful tool we have. Treating others as we would want to be treated is the only road to any kind of peace in one’s life. Mark 12:31, Romans 2:6-11, Romans 12:21, 1 Peter 4:8. His third wish is that youth would work hard in their spheres of influence. Colossians 3:12-17. He also desires that they would reject worldly things and seek godly things. Micah 6:8, 1 John 2:15-17, 1 John 5:1-5. Finally, he hopes youth will remember that they are the light of the world, (that they will disciple and minister to others). Matthew 5:14-16, Romans 1:16-17, 2 Timothy 2:22-26.

Are youth at Highline different from youth at other churches? Chad responds, “They are like most other youth in that they have to struggle with all the pressures of adolescence. They’re transitioning from being children into becoming adults, and that’s a tough job whether you’re a Christian or not. But, unlike most kids who are not raised in the church, they are putting their parents or friend’s faith to the test. The teen years are filled with questioning and testing and that doesn’t leave faith out of the picture.





They are wrestling with the teaching of Jesus, just like most adults, but at the same time, dealing with a media that spends more on them than any other age group- selling false ideas to make a buck. So, they have to make some decisions, they have to sift their way through to the truth. They're looking for their own faith and how they fit into God's picture, and many of them get lots of spiritual bumps and bruises along the way. Thus, the straight and narrow path isn't always the easiest, and we try to remind them of that."

Chad encourages the students to think about and plan for the future. He was especially excited when the first group of young people that the Youth Ministry Team worked with, graduated and made plans to attend colleges and universities- many of them moving on to Christian based education. The majority of these young students graduated with completion of their High School Diplomas and college A.A. Degrees. Some attended the Occupational Skills Center where they received technical job training which they will apply to future careers. One young lady is participating in both OSC and the Running Start Program at the Community College at the same time! Chad cannot praise the youth without giving recognition to the parents! "Their parents are doing a good job raising them and I believe that we have tried to reinforce those same values and ethics which come so hard in this age of relativism."

Chad will be the first to tell you that "your kids will love it here! I love the youth at Highline Christian Church! They are a great group of teens! We have so many different personalities and interests, it's amazing! I can see many of them

becoming church leaders themselves. Being a pastor isn't always an easy thing, you're close to many people's problems and know many things that others don't, but when I look back on each one



of them, I'm proud of them all in some way or another. I pray that they all continue to hold onto their faith, and let the Lord guide and grow them into fine young adults."

While so many teens admire Chad for his skills, it is only fitting to ask him who he admires. His answer is immediate. "I'd have to say my youth staff...they're great! It takes a lot of dedication to work with teenagers sometimes, because emotions have a tendency to run high, and results are slow in many respects. But, they are faithful and enjoy watching the youth mature as much as I do! I was a Youth Ministry volunteer for about a decade before I became a Youth Pastor, and I can say from experience that it can be a big time commitment, but it's worth it in the long run."

Chad, who is blessed with an abundance of energy and enthusiasm, has a special invitation for teens! "If you are a teen and not currently attending a Youth Group, join one! Are there perfect people there? No, but there are adults who love young people and people of all kinds, seeking out what God's plan is for humanity. It's a place to have a good time, learn how to minister, make some friends and even receive some support."

Well, we can't feature the Youth Pastor without featuring the Children's Pastor! So...next time, it's Bret's turn!

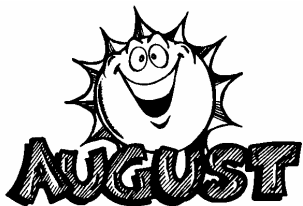
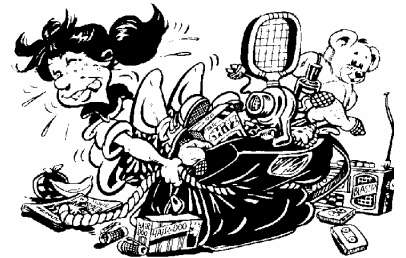
