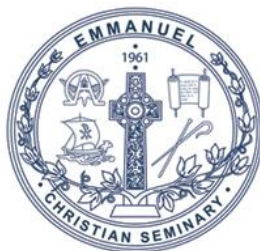

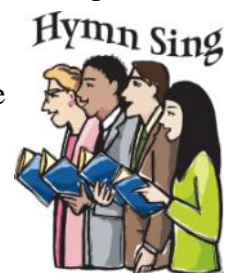

Women's Conference

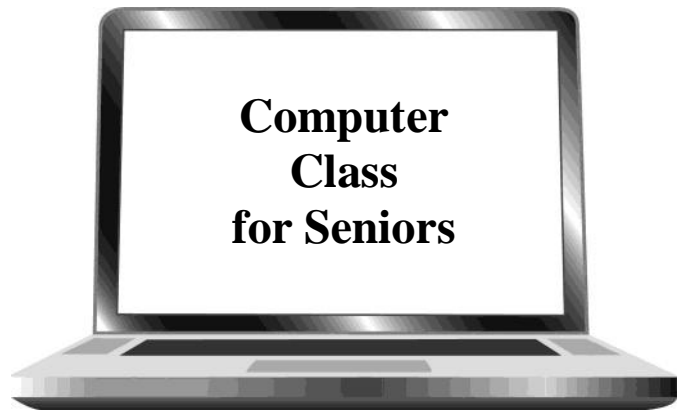
Northwest Christian Women's Conference this year is being held at Warm Beach Christian Camp in Stanwood, Washington from April 29th through May 1st, 2012.

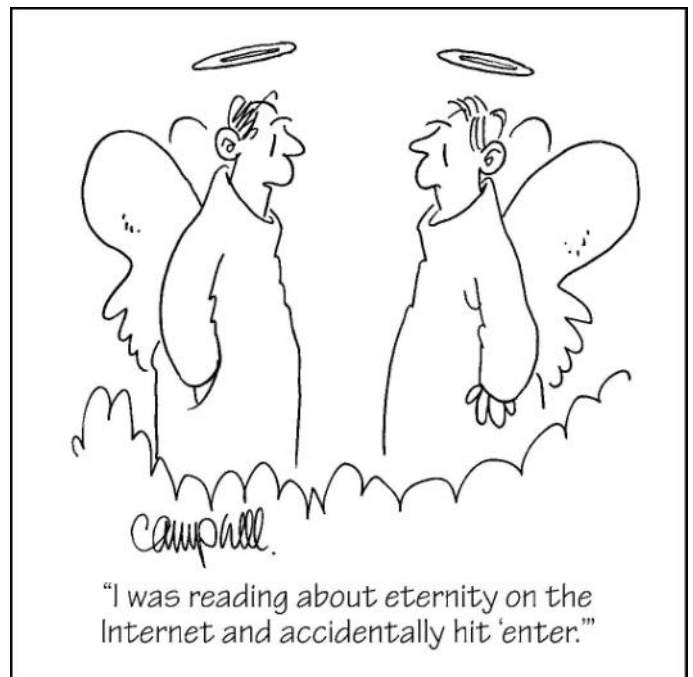
Seniors!! Is your computer being unfriendly to you? Need to brush up your computer skills?

You are invited to... Precinct Caucuses

What is a "Caucus"?

A caucus is the first and most important step in setting the agenda of the political parties. You and your neighbors will meet and discuss the issues you feel the nation and our state should be addressing. What are your views on same-sex marriage, welfare reform, fighting crime, taxation and government spending, national defense, and anything else you feel is important? Your choice in Presidential candidates will also be recorded and will begin the process of selecting the nominees.

Why attend a "Caucus"?

Our form of government works only if people participate and are involved. The political parties develop their ideas and leaders from people who attend their neighborhood caucuses. People like you! In 1988, a young person named Randy Tate attended his first caucus and was later asked to run for the legislature. He won that race and went on to be elected to Congress in 1994. The "Three strikes and you're out" law which was enacted in our state by initiative and is now being enacted all across the nation, was an idea developed from people answering the question: "How can we keep criminals off our streets?"

Who can attend a "Caucus"?

All registered voters. It's fun, it's educational, and it's a place where Christians' ideas and thoughts should be heard. The locations of all party caucuses receive advance press coverage and are generally advertised by the parties.

The Prayer Closet

It is the early morning and dark. I cannot sleep—I'm tired and I'm sick, but still, I cannot sleep. Thoughts flood my mind, keeping me awake. My dad is gone now, and I think about him, about sorrow, about all sorts of things. So I get up and I write—in the dark. I don't really want to be awake, but I must write what is coming to me in my sleeplessness.

It's about the question of "why"—I'm sure you've heard the question. Maybe you've asked it. The Bible even records one man's struggle with the question in the face of his immense loss in the book of Job. Job loses his family, everything he owns, and his health, and he blesses God initially as he starts down the path of loss and grieving. And as he moves down the path, he is surrounded by friends who come to comfort. When he starts to speak, his questions pour out and he longs for death. His friends offer their best wisdom, which does not satisfy, and leaves him ever more petulant about his condition. They are a lesson to would-be comforters of what not to say.

Like Job, when we are faced with a loss, we often ask why:

"Why me?"

"Why my loved one?"

"Why my child?"

"Why did I deserve that?"

But "why" is the least helpful question to ask. Really, what if God told us why? Would it satisfy us? Comfort us? Bring us peace? Or would we, like petulant children, exclaim, "That's no reason!" or "That's not a good enough reason!" Job's friends erroneously told him that it was because of Job's sins that all this came upon him. Job resisted and protested and upheld his integrity. Think about the very broken and dissatisfying reasons people give when loss occurs:

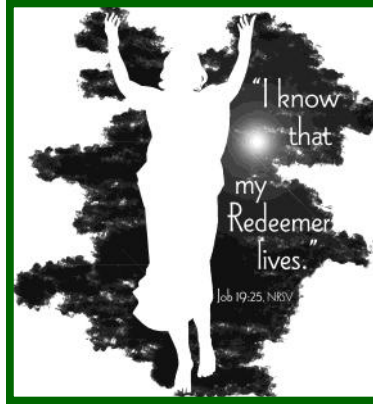
"It was God's will."

"You must have done something to bring this upon yourself."

"God is testing you."

"God has a plan for you."

"God must think you can handle this."



No matter what reason is given, we would not accept it. God looks capricious, mean, and harsh, and we would argue with the Almighty no matter what the reason. In the face of Job's questions, God never answers why. He instead answers "who": "Who is God here—me or you?" Ultimately Job responds, "You." God is not the enemy in times like these.

A better question to ask during these times is: "How?"

"How can I let God use this in my life for good?"

"How can I invest this into God's kingdom and not have this suffering be in vain?"

"How can I glorify God?"

"How can I let God redeem this in my life?"

"How can I trust God through this?"

"How can I encourage myself in the Lord during this time?"

Another great question to ask during these times is: "What?"

"What injustice can be addressed?"

"What good can be done?"

"What can I do to make it through this with the least amount of spiritual damage?"

Questions like these do not take away our sense of loss, nor should that be our goal. Would we really want our grief to disappear? Would we want to feel good over our loss? That seems a little creepy. Would we want to forget them? If we could erase the memory of them and so erase

the pain of our loss, would we want to take that option? Most of the time, we'd probably say no. As much as I hurt over the loss of my family members, I would never want to trade the memories I have of them for peace. I'd like to remember them in peace, and that will come with time.

I'm sure there are some things we would like to completely forget, but those who do, often seek to remember. To be frank, what we long for is wholeness—to be restored to our original state. In most cases, this is impossible. Even where possible, it's unlikely that there would be no scars from the ordeal.

We've heard the adages and platitudes designed to strengthen and encourage, and sometimes they contain important reminders:

“Take this mess and make it your message.”

“When life gives you lemons, make lemonade.”

“What doesn't kill us, makes us stronger.”

“Let this make you better and not bitter.”

And the one that came from Job's own lips: “I know that my Redeemer lives . . . and in my flesh I shall see God.” (Job 19:25, 26) If, and when, God brings good out of it, it is not necessarily the “why” of what happened. It's the Redeemer at work. I want to put myself in the place where God can redeem all my sorrows and work them together for good in my life—that will be my prayer.

How can I trust God through the difficult times in my life? Sometimes we're impacted by the sinful choices of other people that harm us—God can redeem it. Sometimes we make mistakes or poor choices—God uses cracked pots. Some things will need to be endured. We all know that sometimes it can be tough, unpleasant, and downright nasty. I doubt many of us would say, “Sign me up for that!”

I've watched people go through many things: the loss of a child, the loss of multiple children, the loss of a sibling early in life, the loss of children and a spouse the same time, bankruptcy, financial reversal, loss of a business, loss of innocence in a child through exploitation by others, child or spouse incarcerated, cancer or other debilitating diseases in ourselves or loved ones, persecution, torture, Alzheimer in parent's/spouses, moral failure, death of a parent when we're young, death of a parent when we're older, death of a pet, loss of a limb, loss of mobility, divorce, abandonment, loss of a job, and the list goes on and on. I wouldn't volunteer for any of them, but I have already experienced some of these in my life. I wouldn't say I've mastered all the memories, and I can't say I'm happy to have gone through each experience. Each situation has taken its place in my life story and become part of my message, and I assume my dad's passing will take the same course in my life.

For now, I weep for my loss, and maybe his, at every opportunity I get. I will not live here—I will walk with God through it. If I get stuck, I'll reach out and ask for help—that's okay. This is a

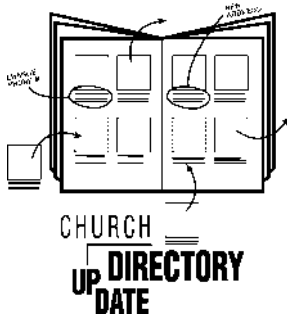
personal journey, but I don't go through it alone. If I ask why, I won't expect an answer—He's God and I'm not. He's not accountable to me—I am accountable to Him. This I know—my Redeemer lives, and I want Him to redeem the whole thing, so I'll keep my eyes peeled for how

that's happening.

I'm done for now. It's been an hour. I'm still in the dark, but I'm heading off to bed—and hopefully off to sleep. I feel better now—scribbling this stream of consciousness on paper. Hopefully someone else will feel better, too, because I recorded and shared these thoughts. The Redeemer is at work!
