## Easter Week Our Response

For many Christians worldwide, Christmas and Easter are the most sacred times of the year. We are approaching one of those times. Some churches refer to the week before Easter as" Holy Week" and many churches will be involved in century old rituals such as "Lent"

Pastor Tim has been preaching a series of sermons

from the Gospel of John. All four Gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, contain the account of the last week of Jesus' life. The Gospels all conclude with the crucifixion, burial, and the glorious resurrection of Jesus Christ. As Pastor Tim continues his relevant, insightful, and inspiring sermons, we will experience the last week of Jesus' life. Pastor Tim will be setting forth the last week with all of the disappointment of the disciples and His followers, the grief of their lost, their doubts and hope of a possible resurrection, and the incredible joy of the resurrection and the return of Jesus. These events resulted in the dedication and commitment of his followers to follow Jesus teaching even to their deaths. With this Holy Season to look forward to, it is an opportunity to recommit ourselves to Jesus and his teaching.

A question was asked;" Could Jesus avoid the crucifixion"? Luke 22 42 records Jesus praying:" Father, if you're willing, take this cup from me, yet not my will, but yours be done."

Jesus could have left Jerusalem. He could have kept his mouth shut and simply disappeared into the desert wilderness. He could have ceased rebuking the powerful religious leaders of His day. He could have walked away from his disciples and the crowds. His popularity and preaching was a threat to the Roman government which had fought many rebellious Jews even during Jesus lifetime. Jesus was being proclaimed as the Messiah, the

Savior, the King of the Jews. Thus he was a threat to the Roman government.

Jesus' teachings called for a "New Way of Life," individually and collectively. He chose to do what God wanted. This led Him to the cross. Many churches place great emphasis on Jesus' death. At Highline Christian Church, Jesus' death is celebrated each week by observing Communion, also known as the Lord's Supper.

The account of the Easter week did not stop at the cross. Praise God it continued with the burial and resurrection of Jesus. The Glorious Resurrection is the pinnacle, the great climax of Jesus' life


The death, the burial, and the resurrection of Jesus have a profound influence on our lives today. It is symbolically portrayed in Christian baptism. The person administering baptism will

say as the person is immersed:" Buried with Christ, to rise to walk in Newness of Life". The individual begins a "New Life in Christ". It is a growing dedicated life to Jesus. All Christians have the opportunity to live this New Life.

An old time hymn is titled;" The Way of the Cross Leads Home". It led Jesus back to an eternal relationship with God.

As we celebrate the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus we can gain strength, guidance, and increased

resolve to live a continuing life with God through Jesus Christ. Eternal life begins here on earth and continues with God and His Son Jesus Christ in Heaven. Glorious, Wonderful Easter Week. Celebrate and experience it by faithfully worshipping God, Sunday by Sunday with other believers during this Easter Season.



### **Reformed Reflections**

An American Sports hero has been revealed to have been a fraud. By his own admission, he's been disgraced. The speculation had been building for months. Lance Armstrong admitted to what he had long denied: that he used performanceenhancing drugs. His admission came to light from his recent highly-publicized two-part interview with Oprah. The media and other

pundits are having a field day.

As an avid recreational cyclist, I have my own thoughts. No doubt, Armstrong has been highly influential. Where Greg Lemond brought legitimacy to The Tour, Armstrong was the catalyst in helping North American cyclists achieve overwhelming success in a

sport once dominated by the Europeans. Regardless of his admission, I still consider him a seven-time Tour de France champion, though his "doping" certainly takes some of the luster off. When I sought to upgrade my road bike several years back, I chose a Trek largely due to his success. I bought and read his book, It's Not About the Bike: My Journey Back to Life and was captivated and motivated by his overcoming and beating cancer- despite the odds- to achieve his unparalleled success in cycling. I know many may not even really care- or have an opinion. Further, Armstrong doesn't even publically profess to be a Christian.

Yet, as a Christian what's my response and what can I learn and observe? Here are three observations I can make:

First, Paul tells us in Romans 3:23, "...that all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." Lance Armstrongs' actions, denials and admission merely confirm this truth. It reminds us that we're all sinners before a holy and righteous God. Only by His grace and mercy can we be made right. None of us are perfect.

Second, in speaking about and warning the Corinthians, Paul says, "So, if you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't fall" (1 Corinthians 12:10 TNIV). Interestingly, in his Oprah interview Armstrong admitted that he thought he was invincible at the peak of his career. I think the application for us here is, don't be too smug or self-confident to think you're on solid ground and nothing can or will ever change that. You might fall. Are we relying on our successes,

> possessions, or present status? Or, are we trusting in God, Who is faithful? Again, Paul reminds us in 2 Corinthians 3:5, "Not that we are sufficient in ourselves to claim anything as coming from us, but our sufficiency is from God" (ESV).

> Third, the Book of Proverbs speaks a lot about pride. In 16:18 we're warned, "Pride goes before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall." This is a general statement of a truth that applies to believers and non-believers alike! It applies to Lance Armstrong as much as to us in being too prideful in our own merits or achievements. May we not relish in another's public disgrace or glory in pride and humble ourselves before our God. For in that case, truly as James says, "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble... humble yourselves before the Lord and He will exalt you." (4:6b, 10)
