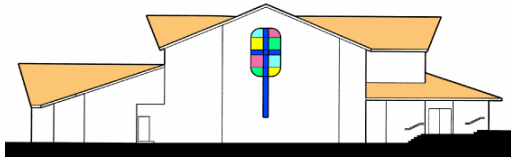

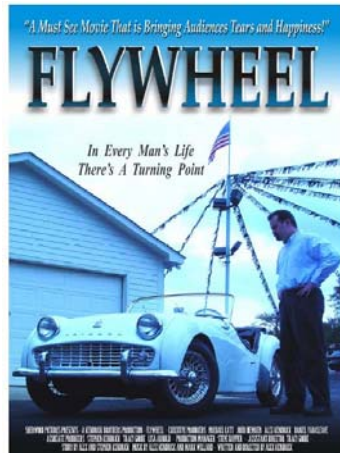


Join Highline families on Sunday evening, November 27, in the Fellowship Hall to begin the Christmas season with fun projects for children and adults.

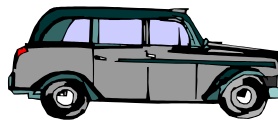

In 1990 the Epilepsy Center at Harborview Medical Center had developed a program to help epileptic patients find and keep employment. The question was raised, "Would that program work for people with brain injury?" To test the idea, they selected Ron Finlay Jr. of Des Moines to try to place and see how the program would work. He was placed with the QFC Manhattan Village store in Normandy Park.

After the six-month "trial period" the store decided to hire Ron Jr. on a long term basis as a part-time courtesy clerk. On October 1st he had completed 15 years with the QFC store. In a short award ceremony with Ron and his parents, store manager John Reese presented Ron his 15 year pin and said that he has made a big contribution to the store.

Ron plans to continue with QFC for the foreseeable future.

No gifts. They have no more space to put things!



Dear Church Family,
I would like to tell you about Iraq. It is about the size of Texas. It has ten to sixteen million people. The majority of the people don't hate us. Do not listen to the news. It is full of deception. The Iraqis enjoy our presence. We have transported lots of important people including senators, the Commandant, and Sergeant Major of the Marine Corps. We fuel F/A-18s and Harriers every night. We do cargo drops every once in awhile, but it is rare.

Our squadron is very lucky out here. We are in a generally safe environment. We sleep inside of cans which are made out of some kind of aluminum but stronger --not really sure though. I used to work 12-14 hours a day, but I developed a more workable schedule so it cut it down to about 8-10 hours a day. I track all the hours, fuel, cargo, and people we transport -- even "angels" -- which is the downside of being here. I hope you know what I mean by the word "angel." Those are some very depressing flights. I also do the planned flights the next day. I make the schedule and give it to higher up to get approved and then route it to all the people that need to know. I also ensure flight safety by supplying our pilots with up-to-date and accurate maps and other such things. I also supply them with coffee for their flights. I ensure every Marine is getting his/her basic training, even during the time of war. Out here they are only required to do a Physical Fitness Test.

The Iraqi people are all around us on base, but they are followed by a few marines. They fix our equipment our air conditioners, electric problems (like fuse brakes etc.). They are our chow hall personnel. Some Africans came to help guard buildings and check points for us. Here's one thing I found interesting at this base. Al Asad, was once nothing but green grass and nice trees. But the army cut the water off to the irrigation system they had here, and so it is all sand now, except one spot still lives. It has hundreds, maybe a thousand, palm trees with nice green bushes and green grass there as well. From what we were told, it is the Al Asad

Oasis which seems to be in the Bible somewhere. But that's just a rumor -- I haven't looked for it yet. The Bible is pretty big to just look for one thing. Thank all of you for your prayers. They are needed and welcomed.

FAMILY BIBLE STUDY IDEAS FOR NOVEMBER

Studying God's Word is an important practice for every believer. As parents you have a huge responsibility to teach your children the importance of spending time with God. ⁵ Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. ⁶ These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. ⁷ Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up." Deuteronomy 6:5-7 This is only one example in Scripture of the importance of teaching our children to love God.

Following are some ideas of family studies you can do this month as we focus on being thankful. Make it a goal to try at least one study time with your family this month.

1. Colossians 3:15-17
 - Read the passage together as a family

 - What do you need to do to be more thankful in your life?
2. Philippians 1:3-6
 - Read the passage together as a family
 - What is Paul thankful for in this passage?
 - Make a list of people you are thankful for, people who have made a difference in your life and your faith.
 - Pray a prayer of thanks for each person on the list.
 - For extra emphasis make a thanksgiving card thanking them for their faith and example for your lives.
3. Philippians 4:10-20
 - Read the passage together as a family
 - What did Paul mean when he said he knew what it is to be in want and to have plenty?
 - Make a list of the gifts God has blessed you with.
 - Spend time in prayer thanking God for His many blessings.
 - Think of a way to bless another family and do it!
