Outdoor Living Nativity December 10 & 11, 2010

Have you ever wished you had been able to go on a mission trip just once in your life? To share the gospel with those that may not have heard or understood and to see the joy on their faces as their tender hearts realize the amazing gift God has given to them through their Savior, Jesus Christ? Well you can, without even leaving town! There are no planes to catch, no long bus rides to make, or borders to cross. This is a mission for young and old alike and it happens each year in December right here at Highline as we transform our parking lot into "The bustling metropolis of Bethlehem" to present the Outdoor Living Nativity.

With stars overhead and the soft noises of the animals in the background, we recount the story of that very first Christmas. As the hot cocoa warms their hands, the news of a Savior warms their hearts. Small children, young teens and stressed parents hear the gospel message and realize it is never too late to "come home." Many have tears on their cheeks as they realize this is a personal gift to them from their Father! What better way to start the Christmas season!

As you can imagine, this effort of love requires lots of support. The cast is made up of over 30 humans, 3 goats, 3 llamas and several well behaved sheep! There are many opportunities for you to participate in this mission. Most things only take an hour or less of your time. If you have more time, I hope you will consider helping with or being part of the cast. Except for the animals, there are **no** speaking parts. The 20-minute play is totally narrated and set to music so there is nothing to memorize. Every year we have been able to use real babies to play the part of Jesus... this takes several babies so if you have a little one I hope you will consider this literally an opportunity of a lifetime! We pray that you will join us on the mission field as we share the story of God's greatest gift to us all, the birth of His Son, Jesus.

Where to park, where to park?

Some of you have noticed the main parking lot is very full. If you haven't noticed, it's probably because you come early to first service. We're again asking able-bodied, committed-attendees to park further away so that people who have trouble walking and visitors can find a spot more easily.

There are two options that we have been given permission to use other than the main lot:

- The Toyota service lot. This is across 150th from the church building. There is even a limited amount of covered parking here.


'Twas the Night Before a Wonderful Christmas Carol

Operation Christmas Child

Once again, this year, we are packing boxes for Operation Christmas Child. These boxes will be sent to children, often in other countries,

for whom this may be their only Christmas gift. Would you please consider blessing a child this Christmas in this simple, special way! OCC shoe boxes, with instructions for packing, are available at the Higher Ground Children's check-in counter in the south building, the Early Childhood check-in counter in the north building, and in the Kindergarten Sunday School classroom.

As a congregation, we are not collecting individual items, but complete boxes along with the \$7 fee for shipping costs. If you don't feel you can complete an entire box on your own, you may team up with one or two other families to complete a box.

A good guideline for a complete box is:

- 1 "snuggle" item (ie. small doll, stuffed animal),
- 1 "warm" item (ie. hat, gloves, t-shirt, socks),
- 1 "write-on" item (ie. journal, notepad, drawing pad, coloring book),
- 1 "write-with" item (ie. crayons, sharpened colored pencils, marker pens, sharpened pencils with sharpeners, pens),
- 2-3 "something to play with" items (ie. playdoh, balls, hot wheel cars, calculators, new McDonald toys, jumpropes, sidewalk chalk, mini puzzles, yo-yos, harmonicas, kazoos, mini Etch-a-Sketch toys, rubber stamps and stamp pads, toy jewelery, watches),
- 2-4 "something necessary" items (ie. washcloth, soap (in a ziploc bag), toothbrush, toothpaste, comb/brush, flashlight (with batteries), and a bag of candy/gum (ie. lollipops, mints, Jolly Ranchers, gum, Smarties, any hard candy).

Keep in mind that pencils need to be sharpened, toys that need batteries need batteries included,

soap and candy are items which need to be in Ziploc® bags.

DO NOT include used or damaged items, war-related items such as guns, knives, or military figures, chocolate, out-of-date candy, food other than hard candy and gum, liquids (i.e. shampoo or lotion), medications or vitamins, breakable items or aerosol cans.

Checks should be made payable to Samaritan's Purse with "Operation Christmas Child" in the memo line. The check should be placed in the box, on top of the items.

You are welcome to include a personal note or photo of yourself or your family. If you include your name and address, the child who receives your box may write you back. The Kindergarten class received a note from a boy in the Philippines who received one of our boxes last year and it was very rewarding to hear from one of the recipients.

If you are unable to complete an entire box, but would still like to donate, please contact Tammie Lindblom.

Empty boxes are available now.

Completed boxes must be returned to either check-in counter or the Kindergarten classroom by Sunday, November 14.
