

Africa Hope Thoughts

Sometimes as we rush through our busy lives, we forget that God is in all we are doing; He is the unseen spectator.

How sad he must be, when we forget that He is with us.

That is how I felt when I left to go to Kenya, I was busy getting myself ready for the trip and getting my family ready for my absence; I forgot to acknowledge Him in my daily comings and goings. Although I was praying for everything I knew I should be praying for, I don't think I really did it in a way that was pleasing to him; for me it was just one more check off on my list of things to do before I left. In Kenya, God reminded me of what was truly important; JESUS.

While in Kenya, Jesus allowed me to step out of my busy, hurried life and let me experience the gift of relationships. During our time at Africa Hope, I was blessed to have time to really get to know my brothers and sisters in Christ who live a totally different reality than I do.

One day, I was sitting outside the dorms we were staying in, just breathing and taking in all the changes I was experiencing, wondering to myself 'What could God have me do in such a wonderful place as Africa Hope.' As I sat, Tom one of the Africa Hope team members came walking up the hill towards me.

'Hello' Tom said, 'Are you doing okay today?' I answered that I was doing fine and that I was just breathing Africa Hope in. Tom proceeded

to sit down next to me and we got a chance to talk about our lives.

Now mind you, Tom was suppose to be working and after about 20-30 minutes I asked 'Tom, you aren't going to be in trouble because I am taking up all your time, are you?'

Tom replied 'This is what God sent you here to do, get to know us and learn about Africa Hope.' Tom understood before I did, we were engaging in the Lords work — true fellowship.

Since being back in the U.S, I have reflected on my experiences at Africa Hope and all of the people of Kenya. Our sermons have been about 'True Freedom' and I have found that although I am a believer in Christ, I often have fallen back into selfishness and self-centeredness.

The time in Kenya has helped me focus, not on what I think is important but what God thinks is important. Now this is a daily struggle but I

know that Christ is holding my hand through all of it. After all he reminds me daily; My God will meet all my needs according to his glorious riches in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:19

Africa Hope is teaching everyone who is associated with the organization, how to live daily in the presence of God. They start out their days with a daily devotion and prayer time. They pray for each other and encourage each other, always giving praise to God for everything; the good and the bad. They completely rely on God for their needs. How much richer 'true freedom' would we have if we could just do the same?

We are praising God for the great time we've been having at Summit Trekkers so far this year. I'd like to thank all the parents who were able to make it for our first night and I pray it was beneficial for you to be able to experience a little of what the kids are doing each week. I'd also like to say it's been great having a number of parents joining us for the Anticipate and Blessing portions of our evenings, I pray it is helping you build bridges to lead your children closer to Jesus.

This year a typical Summit Trekker night looks something like this:

Anticipate - A short activity time for kids and parents to begin to engage the lesson.

Celebrate - A time of connecting with each other and celebrating our combined effort in learning the "Remember Verse" and working toward our "Minute to win it" game night.

The Big God Story - A time of hearing about a portion of God's big story and how we are a part of it.

Large Group Response - An opportunity for the kids (& staff) to respond to the work the Holy Spirit is doing in our lives. Response stations include things like: Prayer Cross where kids write prayers and nail them to a cross; Prayer Journals; Praying for our faith community by praying for our missionaries; and Worship in song and dance.

Small Group Response - A time to connect in small groups to further discuss what we heard in the Big God Story and to work together to create a craft of some sort connecting us to what we've just heard.

Blessing - A time to pray together as a small group and with our parents. This is also an opportunity for us as leaders to pray a blessing over the children as they head out to live their part of the God story.

Homefront - The weekly and monthly take home to inspire and equip parents to lead their children to know Jesus.
