

## The Prayer Closet

Have you found yourself after a church service feeling a little dry? Did your mind wander far and anon as you sat in your seat? Did you grumble about the songs, the style of the person sharing the communion meditation, or the lighting and sound issues that popped up? Did you get annoyed by the child that cried in the service or wiggled about? Are you wondering if you need a new church? Perhaps instead of a new church, you might need to pray the church service.

What does that mean—pray the church service? Certainly it means to pray for the church service. It's important for us to pray for the work of the church, including the regular worship services. The Holy Spirit does the work in the hearts and lives of others. We can plan and execute until the cows come home, and it is important to do that, to be sure, but without the Holy Spirit at work, it means little. We need to pray that the Holy Spirit will work in and through us to convict us of sin, righteousness, and judgment to come (John 16:8). We need to pray that we will not quench or grieve the Holy Spirit working in our lives (I Thessalonians 5:19 and Ephesians 4:30).

But over and above praying for the church service, we need to bring our hearts to worship through prayer. Unless we do this, we can be in danger of becoming connoisseurs of fine worship.

## Outdoor Living Nativity December 12 & 13, 2014

Have you ever wanted to go on a mission trip? Would you like to be able to share the gospel with those who may not have heard. Well, you can, and without even leaving town! There are no planes to catch, no long bus rides, no borders to cross. This is a mission for young and old alike, and it happens each year in December right here at Highline Christian Church, as we turn a corner of our parking lot into "the bustling metropolis of Bethlehem!"

With stars overhead, and the soft noises of the animals in the background, we tell the story of the very first Christmas, the story of the birth of Jesus. As cups of hot chocolate warm the hands of those in the audience, the news of a Savior warms their hearts. Small children, young teens, and stressed parents hear the gospel message and realize it is never too late to "come home." Many have tears on their cheeks as they realize this is a personal gift to them from their Heavenly Father. What better way to begin the Christmas season.

As you can imagine, this effort of love requires lots of support. The cast is made up of over 30 humans, 3 llamas, several rather well-behaved sheep, and one not-so-well-behaved donkey! And there are many working behind the scenes to make this Christmas outreach possible.

There are many opportunities for you to participate in this special mission. Most of those opportunities take as little as an hour or two of your time.

“The pastor’s sermon seemed to be a little light in the meat department today. I didn’t get hardly a thing out of it.”

“I do believe the choir sang that same number a few months back. They really need to learn new songs to inspire us.”

“I was so blessed by the service today—everything was just perfect.”

As connoisseurs of fine worship, we can miss the whole point of the worship service—which is to worship our Lord! We truly don’t need perfectly satisfying music that suits our tastes, ecstatic prayers, choirs singing like angels, everyone sitting happily at attention, and the list goes on and on. The service isn’t there to entertain us or move us. We are there to worship God through the service with our whole mind, soul, heart, and strength.

So . . . how do we pray the service? Here are a few suggestions:

First, **pray before the service** that God would prepare our hearts to meet with Him so that we might worship Him in spirit and in truth and be the worshipper that God seeks according to John 4:23.

Second, **pray along with the different parts** of the service:

We can pray the words of the songs as we sing them. If we struggle with the words, because they don’t quite capture what is in our hearts, we can then pray that to the Lord. If we are grumbling in our hearts about the song itself, confess it to the Lord. Ask Him to help us direct our hearts to true worship, even if we find the songs not to our tastes. After all, the music is not about us—it’s about the Lord. In addition, you and I aren’t the only ones in the service—there are other people who need to meet with the Lord, who have burdens, and who need a word of encouragement. Maybe the songs are for them today, and not for you and me. But if our focus is on the Lord, then all the songs can become a prayer to the Lord, and we can praise, glorify, and honor Him through them. A while back, I heard a story from a woman about how her husband, having strayed from the faith, was won back to the Lord by a song that I just can’t stand! While I still don’t love that song, I am aware that I am only one

Except for the animals, there are no speaking parts. This 20-minute play is totally narrated and set to music, so there are no lines for cast members to memorize. Every year we have a host of angels, several small groups of shepherds, a traveling family, the inn keeper and his wife, a stable boy/girl, the three wise men with their gift bearers, Mary, Joseph, and of course Baby Jesus. We use real babies for the part of Jesus, so if you have a little one, we hope you will consider this an opportunity of a lifetime.

We also need a drama director, people to help the younger children with their costumes, people to put up the Bethlehem set on the Saturday before the performances and take the set back down and put it away on the Sunday after the performances. We need people to help set up the lighting and sound systems, parking lot attendants, people to run sound and lights, people to prepare and serve a cast dinner just prior to the first performance, people to make and serve hot chocolate to our “guests,” people who will take time to pray for this community outreach event, and many more.

We will have cast member and volunteer sign-ups on the first three weekends of November. We pray that you will join us on the mission field as we share the story of God’s greatest gift to us all, the birth of His Son, Jesus.

among many, and worship is not about me, but about us. If God can restore a person through that song, I'm happy to sing it, even if I'm not a fan! It might be that someone else needs that song today.

We can pray along with the person who leads in prayer—not just the “amen”, but right along with the thoughts and words expressed, adding to them and expanding the thought in whispers.

We can pray during the communion meditation—as we hear it—and then as we partake of the elements, and afterwards, during the quiet time. Let's thank God for what He did for us through Jesus. Confess our sins to the Lord—He died to help us overcome them.

We can pray as the offering passes by us—asking God to bless and multiply the offering to His work in the church, in the community, and in the world, and to bless and meet the needs of the givers—who cannot out give God.

We can pray for the causes of distraction that try to draw us away—perhaps for the crying child or the person whose fragrance is overwhelming you. Whatever it is, pray about it, them, and about our hearts' attitude toward them.

We can pray during the message—that God will help our understanding of the message and apply it to our hearts and lives.

We can pray for each other during the service-- that God would speak to the hearts of those present to worship, grow in relationship to Him, and follow Jesus better. Years ago, while attending another church, my husband told me about something he learned one day after what was, in his opinion, a less-than-inspiring service. He was standing in line to greet the pastor when he overheard the woman in front of him emotionally exclaim, “Oh, Pastor, that message was meant just for me!” At that moment, it dawned on him that he wasn't the only one present in the service—there were others. And they all brought their needs along with them to church. If something is not tugging at our hearts that day, perhaps someone else needs encouragement of a different sort. We can pray for them to receive that

encouragement and receive our spiritual food in the process! Jesus speaks of the true food of doing the will of His Father who sent Him in John 4:34. Bearing one another's burdens is part of that work. We can pray that the Lord would open our hearts to one another so that we can minister to each other.

We can pray about whether we need to move forward to rededicate our lives, or if we need to go pray with the prayer teams at the front of the church. Perhaps we need to make something right with

someone. Did God speak to our hearts about something in particular? If so, then maybe we could share it with the prayer teams and ask them to join us in prayer. Praying with others is not a weakness. James 5:16 reminds us to confess our trespasses to one another and pray for one another, that we may be healed. There are some things that will continue to fester if we refuse to bring them to the light and seek God's healing and support from our brothers and sisters in Christ through prayer.


We can pray with thanksgiving for the entire service, and the parts we found particularly poignant to our hearts.

Finally, pray after the service that God would help us apply the message to our lives. Seek for one thing from the service to apply to our lives. It might be from the scripture reading, from a song, from the communion message, from the message, or from the prayer. Does it matter where it comes from, or just that it comes? The whole service doesn't have to speak to our hearts—we just need one treasured nugget. After all, it's hard to apply more than that at a time.

As we fully engage with the Lord throughout the service through prayer, we will find the distractions fading away, the fellowship with others and our Lord grow more meaningful, and a deepening appreciation for what He is doing among us. We will find ourselves growing as followers of Christ. You see, it's not about us getting something out of the service—it's about us bringing ourselves to the service to worship the Lord together in community. ~ *Carole Marcille*

I was born in Paradise, California. Fun fact: My brother-in-law Tim Crawford grew up in Paradise. It's a heavenly place to be from!






