## Outdoor Living Nativity December 11 & 12, 2015

Would you like to be able to share the gospel with those who may not have heard? Would you like to be able to help lift up those who are hurting?

Well...you can. This is a mission for old and young alike, and it happens each year in December right here at Highline Christian Church, as we turn a corner of our parking lot into the Little Town of Bethlehem.

With stars overhead, and the noises of the animals in the background, we tell the story of the very first Christmas, the story of the birth of Jesus. As cups of hot chocolate warm the hands of those in the audience, the news of a Savior warms their hearts. Small children, young teens, and stressed parents hear the gospel message and realize it is never too late to "come home." Many have tears on their cheeks as they realize this is a personal gift to them from their Heavenly Father. What better way to begin the Christmas season.

This effort of love requires lots of support. The cast is made up of over 30 humans, 3 llamas, several rather well behaved sheep, and 1 not so well behaved donkey! And there are many working behind the scenes to make this Christmas outreach possible. There are many opportunities for you to participate in this special mission. Most of those opportunities take as little as an hour or two of your time.

Except for the animals, there are no speaking parts. This 20-minute play is totally narrated and set to music, so there are no lines for cast members to memorize. Every year we have a host of angels, a group of shepherds, a traveling family, the inn keeper and his wife, a stable boy/girl, the three wise men with their gift bearers, Mary, Joseph, and of course baby Jesus. We use real babies for the part of Jesus, so if you have a little one we hope you will consider this an opportunity of a lifetime.

We also need people to help the younger children with their costumes, people to put up the Bethlehem set on the Saturday before the performances and take the set back down and put it away on the Sunday after the performances. We need people to help set up the lighting and sound systems, parking lot attendants, people to run sound and lights, people to prepare and serve a cast dinner just prior to the first performance, people to make and serve hot chocolate to our "guests," and people who will take time to pray for this community outreach event, and many more. We need lots of PEOPLE!

We pray that you will join us on the mission field as we share the story of God's greatest gift to us all, the birth of His Son, Jesus. ☞

Do you know what the most frequently asked HUB question is?


*“Why can't people see my address and phone number when they are signed into the HUB?”*

When the church first launched the HUB, we were sensitive to the fact that many people did not want their phone numbers and addresses listed on the internet. Now that there is a greater understanding that the HUB is actually a closed environment, this is a good time to update your privacy settings.

To do that please follow the steps listed below:

- 1) Log in
- 2) Click on your name located in the upper right hand corner
- 3) In the drop down menu, click on “privacy settings”
- 4) Scroll down to “Contact-Phone”—use the drop down arrows to assign who can see which phone numbers
- 5) Repeat the above procedure for “Contact-Address”

Just a reminder, this information is **NOT** available by a Google search or any other type of Internet search. Please remember that only Highline people that are logged into the HUB can see your information.

## The Spoken Words of God

Highline Christian Church is extremely fortunate to have Dr. Timothy Knight as the Senior Minister. He is extremely well educated, having completed a B.A. in New Testament and Pastoral Ministry, a Master of Divinity, and a Doctor of Ministry. Two of these degrees are from Emmanuel Christian Seminary in Tennessee. Accomplishing this required years of dedication and also involved the support of his lovely wife Jane, and his wonderful family.

This article focuses on the sermon portion of the worship service. The sermon itself, involves 30 or more minutes of the total worship service. It begins as Pastor Tim steps forward, opens the Bible, and reads the scripture for the sermon. He holds up the Bible and says; "This is the Word of the Lord" and the congregation responds; "thanks be to God." Many people have asked the writer; "how does Pastor Tim create a sermon each week that is Biblical, inspiring, and filled with words to live by?" In response to that question Pastor Tim answered a series of questions which are presented as follows.

### **What do you believe is the main purpose for the sermon in HCC's worship service?**

"Charles Swindoll said: "If there's a mist in the pulpit, there's a fog in the pew!" Preaching, as I see it, is being used by God to "clear the fog." The purpose of life is to know God through Jesus, and to live that faith in our everyday lives when we are away from the church building. Preaching is to take the timeless truth of God's Word, and help the congregation understand and apply it to life. The goal is to leave the service thinking, feeling, interacting, and reaching out more like Jesus. No matter where I am in the text of the Bible, preaching ought to always ultimately point to Jesus and our hope in Him."

### **What process do you employ in deciding on the topic and scripture for your Sermons?**

"I'm a big reader. When I prepare to preach a passage, I read over a dozen commentaries on the text. I look at the culture, the background of the book, the parallel passages, the key words, and more. The goal is to understand what God was communicating to the first century audience and what principles we can apply to our life situation today. I believe God's Word is ALWAYS applicable and relevant. The hard part is narrowing the text to ONE TOPIC and fleshing that topic out in ways that are both biblically true and practically understandable for the Christian seeking to hear from God."

### **Why do you preach series of Sermons such as your series on the Gospel of Mark?**

"I love to preach through a book of the Bible. Many preachers are topical, jumping from text to text to make a point. There is a place for that type of preaching, but for me, the power of the text is best seen when we make our way through an entire book together. Over a period of weeks, months, or even years that particular writer (Mark at the moment) -his style, theme, purpose, points become clear as we sit with his work for a while. It means I can't skip the hard passages or simply ride a hobby horse on my favorite doctrine or issue. I take the text as it comes and deal with what God is communicating to us through each passage."

**What role do you believe the Holy Spirit has in: (1.) Determining the topic/subject? (2.) Determining the focus of the sermon? (3.) Developing the sermon? (4.) The delivery of the sermon?**

“I believe the Bible is the inspired Word of God. He is the author behind the authors. So if I’m preaching Scripture, the Holy Spirit is intimately involved from before the beginning of each message. I pray for the Holy Spirit to be present in the whole homiletical process –the study, theme choice, illustrations, and definitely the delivery. So many preachers are great scholars. They know their stuff, but they put little to no concentration on the delivery. That’s sad. I want to communicate God’s powerful truth **POWERFULLY!!!** You might see me mumbling on the stage just before I step forward to read the Word. That’s because I’m asking the Holy Spirit, one more time to bless and use this message for God’s glory.”

**What can the church members/congregation do to assist you in; (1) As you prepare your sermons? (2.) During the delivery of the sermon? (3.) In their response to the sermon?**

“(1) Pray for me all week as I write the message. Pray for time for study and prayer. Pray for solid choices in what to say and not say. Pray for clear illustrations that will drive home the Word to our lives today.

(2) Pray for health, strength of the voice, focus. I try to remember that even though it’s the third service and I preached this message in two other services, God still has something for THIS group of believers!

(3) COME EXPECTING to hear from God through His Word. Come rested! Come prayed up! Come eager to hear the Word! Come distraction free! Come committed to take ONE thing from the message and apply it to your personal walk with the Lord. It is an honor beyond measure to have the privilege of preaching each week to the family at Highline.”

Is the sermon an important part of the HCC worship service? Yes it is because God is speaking through a dedicated individual in Pastor Tim as he interprets and applies the scripture, God’s word. Members of the congregation have made remarks in my hearing, such as; “that sermon hit me dead center”, “I feel uplifted and ready for the week ahead,” and “now I have a lot to think about and decisions to make.” By applying the message of the sermon to their lives, people are blessed, inspired, and their lives are changed. Pray that God will continue to bless Highline Christian Church and Pastor Tim and his family.

## We Need Hams!


The next time Highline is scheduled to provide a meal at Transform Burien Outreach will be Sunday November 22. That is the Sunday immediately prior to Thanksgiving.

Highline will be offering a class in the future about Radical Islam and ISIS. This will be a good opportunity to learn more about current events and how we should respond. Not all Islam is radical and we are seeing more and more Muslim individuals and families coming to the US every year. This year the Highline's World Outreach has added a work that can help Christians understand and reach out to these individuals and families. The Crescent Project is a work dedicated to this task.

**Are Allah and God the same?** Christian Arabs have used "Allah" as the Arabic word for God for centuries – even before Islam came into being. Therefore, it's a legitimate use of the word in Arabic.

However, we teach that the character and personality of the god of Islam is not the same character and personality as the God who authored the Bible and revealed Himself to us through Jesus.

**Crescent Project's mission** is to inspire, equip and serve the Church to reach Muslims with the Gospel of Christ for the Glory of God. It is their vision to see a day when fear is replaced with love and millions of Christians are actively sharing the truth of Christ with millions of Muslims for the glory of God. Crescent Project does this through prayer, training, local outreach, and short-term trips.

**Prayer** is vital for effective ministry to our Muslim neighbors. Join Christians from around North America in praying specifically for Muslims every Friday at noon.

**Training** is essential for effective ministry among Muslims. Crescent Project's Bridges seminar and DVD study provide a practical understanding of Muslims, as well as methods that any Christian can use to effectively communicate the Gospel. A three-day Oasis conference is an introduction and affirmation to what God is doing in the Muslim world. The one-week Sahara challenge takes a deeper look at Islam, culture, and ministry skills to prepare leaders for work among Muslims.

**Local Outreach** is the means of sharing the Hope of Christ with Muslims. Crescent Project is dedicated to establishing growing groups of Christians committed to sharing Christ's love with the Muslims around them. Their staff act as mentors to the leaders of these groups, and provide ongoing training and resources to help them flourish.

**Short-term Trips** allows the project to provide life changing opportunities for Christians to immerse themselves in Muslim culture, build personal relationships, and participate in ministry with local believers. Their trips are designed to stretch and challenge team members to further invest themselves in reaching out to the Muslim world.




## *Birth through Kindergarten*
