

Tickets are now available for \$10 per person (all ages), which also includes an audio tour. The tickets are timed entry beginning at 7:00 P.M. and then every 15 minutes. The center is estimating that people will spend 1 - 1.5 hours in the exhibit. PSCC Bible faculty will be on hand to answer questions and facilitate your enjoyment of the exhibit.

What's Happening With The New Building?

In the Education Wing: The first floor framing is done! The floor joists for the second floor are going up soon (we're just waiting for them to be delivered).

In the Worship Center: Thank you to all the volunteers. The sound and main electrical wiring is nearly complete. The beam sanding project is nearly complete. The company installing the fire sprinkler system has started work and is expecting to be completely done in three weeks. The sheet rocking can start as soon as the sprinkler system is done in a particular area.

Outside: Landscaping planting work has begun. We need a lot of volunteers to help with this. Please contact Jane Docherty to sign-up or to ask questions. We need people with rototillers.

Security: We still need help with Night Watch. Sign-up on Sunday on the sheet under the covered breezeway or call Gregg Louvier to sign-up or for more info. If you'd like to help with this in another way, we could use someone who's willing to make a few phone calls occasionally.

Prayer Needs:

- Main Electrical Service: We are discussing options with Seattle City Light. Their decision and their timing for installing the main electrical vault and service could have a big impact on the project's schedule. Please pray for a quick decision and an installation schedule that doesn't delay the project.
- Colors & Textures Sub-team: We have a sub-team who is making a lot of little decisions about colors, textures, and other

specific designs. This takes A LOT of time and is sometimes difficult. Please pray for God's blessing on them and their efforts.

- Landscaping: Please pray for God's direction for the building team on how much of this to hire-out and how much the congregation can do.



Meet Bonnie Warner

They say once a dancer....always a dancer. I bet if you were to ask Bonnie Warner to describe a plié or a pirouette she could do it. Do you know we have a genuine, professional ballerina, in the

Highline Christian Church congregation?

Years ago, when Bonnie performed Swan Lake for her audition with the New York City Ballet, she was in the company of hopefuls from California to Alaska. She does not admit to being nervous...well, not *during* the audition, anyway. It was afterwards, that the jitters hit. Being accepted with the New York City Ballet would be for many, a dream. For Bonnie, it was the achievement of a lifetime. She had studied at Cornish and worked hard to be accepted. Yes, The Lord has blessed Bonnie with wonderful gifts- one being the gift of dance.

Bonnie, her daughter Margie Sannes, granddaughters Jennifer and Tanya, and grandson Jeff are regular faces at Highline. In fact, Bonnie, Margie and Jennifer were baptized on the same day. Bonnie fondly recalls the day, "I had been sprinkled but never immersed. I felt this was the real thing. It was like the best day in my life." When she thinks of that special baptism day, she recalls friend Sue. Sue sings in the choir, is a preschool teacher and was the first one to welcome Bonnie to Highline. Bonnie remembers, "She had the most beautiful smile."

Four years ago, the first time Bonnie walked through the doors of Highline Christian Church, she felt surrounded by warmth. She remembers the friendly greeting and wondering...*why has it taken me so long to get to this church?* Every Sunday, she feels like many people feel about Pastor Tim's sermons- "every Sunday he preaches to me." She would continue to meet many friends, although she cannot name just one person at Highline who has made a difference in her life. After all, there are so many. There are Clint and Paul Kelly and their Mother Joyce, along with Clint's wife. Bonnie remarks, "They have kind of adopted me." She has met friends through being a Greeter, helping with communion, and donating goodies to the kitchen. "I want to thank each one

for being so kind. Everyone I have met has played an important part in my life. And I mean that from the bottom of my heart."

In 1937, Bonnie moved to this area from Wenatchee. She was raised in a home where music played a key role. She is quick to describe the 50's as "a wonderful era." Her sister was a classical singer. Mom played piano, and Dad played an assortment of instruments- banjo, harmonica, trombone, saxophone and the bugle. For a family with mega-musical talent, Bonnie modestly comments, "We were just a normal, plain family."

This is one busy woman! Not only has Bonnie taught Ballet, Tap and Hula, but she is a football fan! Oh sure she loves the Seahawks, but even they can't compare to her favorite football player- great-grandson Jordan Warner. Jordan is Highline High School's First String, and a fourth generation in the family to be on the team! Bonnie can catch the Seahawks on television, but she will get drenched, stand in the pouring rain...whatever it takes, to cheer Jordan! She did this for her grandchildren and she's not about to stop now with her great-grandchildren! She is also blessed with other precious great-grandchildren: Ryan- age 12, brother Joshua- age 5, Trevor- age 7, Ethan- age 5, and Colan- age 2. She's not finished yet! Another great-grandchild will be born in approximately 6 months!

Bonnie enjoys anything involving people and handwork, and she used to do some creative oil painting. Baby sitting her great-grandchildren rates high on her favorite things to do list. For the future, Bonnie plans to attend Shoemaker Circle, and attend Bible Study- which she says she has not done in years. She also plans to travel to Eastern Washington to see dear friends she misses from childhood. She loves the Bible, and has a strong faith. As she says, "I couldn't live a day of my life without The Lord."

When asked how she likes the new Sanctuary, Bonnie confesses to worrying- well just a little. She is actually worried about one person in particular. With the worship services being changed from three Sunday services to two when the Sanctuary is complete, Bonnie has to wonder if the new spacious Sanctuary will welcome even *more* people. Then, Sunday worship may be forced to revert back to three services. She giggles, "I want poor Pastor Tim to have an hour off!"
