We do not yet have a target date for opening the adjoining Education Wing but we praise God for the continued progress that is being made!

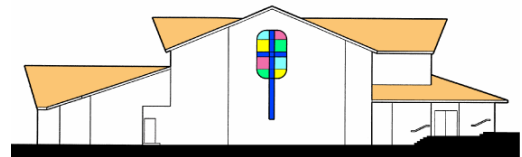
What's Happening with the New Building?

TOUCH Classes Coming this Fall

The next set of TOUCH classes have been scheduled:

TOUCH 1 on October 6th
TOUCH 2 on October 20th
TOUCH 3 on November 10th

All classes are in the morning from 9:00 - noon, with lunch provided afterwards. So that we can plan accordingly, we need you to sign up in advance. Sign-up sheets for all three are available in the Family Mailbox room or you can call the church office (206-243-4333).

“TOUCH” is an acronym for our purpose statement and you can get a full explanation of that in the TOUCH 1 class. TOUCH 1 is ideal for new members or those considering membership at Highline. We also encourage long-time members to take it so that we all have the same foundation. The class covers what it means to be a Christian, what it means to be a member in the church universal, and what Highline specifically is about.

TOUCH 2 is about habits – good habits. Whether you're a relatively new Christian wanting to establish some good habits or a seasoned Christian wanting to enhance or refine your habits, this class is for you. The habits that we deal with are Bible study, prayer, personal devotion time, tithing, and fellowship.

TOUCH 3 takes the next step and deals with your personal ministry. Whether you want to find an area of ministry to get involved in or if you aren't sure if you're in the right area of ministry, this class will help. It looks at your spiritual gifts, heart, abilities, personality, and experiences to guide you to an area of ministry that is right for you.

In addition to the things you'll learn, the classes are a neat opportunity to connect with a small group of people in a different way.

The Bible Answer Man is Coming to Town!



KGW AM 820, Seattle's Christian talk radio station, is having its 4th Annual Listener Appreciation Event on Sunday October 7th.

This year the guest speaker will be Bible Answer Man, Hank Hanegraaff, national radio show host, president of the Christian Research Institute and author of several best-selling books.

This free event will be held at Cedar Park Church in Bothell. Doors open at 5 P.M., event starts at 6 pm and will last until 8 P.M. The event will begin with worshipping along with the Cedar Park Worship Team. Hank will then give a 45-minute talk, followed by a 35 – 40 minute question and answer period. This is a great opportunity to ask any nagging question you have about the Bible or *anything* to do with apologetics (like what do I say to a Mormon, Jehovah Witness, atheist, etc.?). Afterwards, refreshments will be served, along with book-signing.

Cedar Park Church can be reached by taking I-405, using exit #22, NE 160th St. Go west towards Bothell. Turn right onto 112th Ave. NE and travel approximately ½ mile. The church building is located on the right-hand side of the road.

Last year's event featured Alistair Begg at Mars Hill Church in Ballard. This fabulous event was attended by a standing-room only audience of 1,500 people, with 200 turned away! So please be advised - if you want to be assured a seat, don't show up at the last minute!

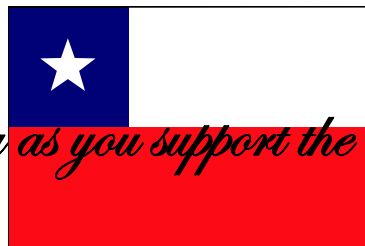

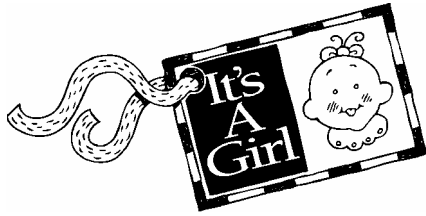

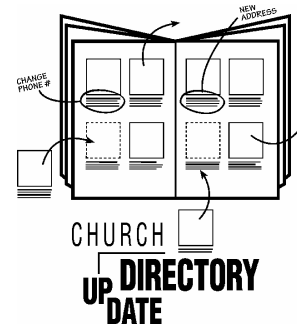

God Speaks for Single Mom

A friend of mine named LaTasha, recently received a glimpse of God's understanding and presence in her life. As a single parent of two young sons, she was financially struggling. She needed money to apply toward her rent. She had not told anyone about her need, choosing to rely on her faith that the money would appear.

She attended her regular Wednesday evening church service, where she gathered with a group of about 20 people. It was during this quiet time that the wife of the senior pastor suddenly spoke. The pastor's wife announced, "God put someone on my heart. She's a member of our church." She went on to explain that this person does many things for the church, and shared a little personal information about her. LaTasha sat in the group, hearing the message and contemplating what she would be able to give. She was aware there were many single parents at the church and she was pleased that the church was about to help someone in need. LaTasha's name was announced to the group. People started giving...and giving...and giving. Purses and wallets opened, and there were lots of hugs. LaTasha wept, and recalls she felt as if she would collapse. She had not told anyone that she was in need — not one single person. There was someone who knew though. God. He obviously delivered a message about her circumstances to the pastor's wife. That night, LaTasha was instructed to stay a short time after the group meeting. The pastor wanted to present her with a check before she went home.

LaTasha and her two sons had recently moved into an apartment complex with a basketball court. The boys wanted a basketball so they could shoot hoops. Her son was given a basketball that night!

As if this were not enough excitement, LaTasha has been trying to lose weight. It has been her dream to have a personal trainer and/or nutritionist. A pastor's wife, who has a state-of-the-art gym in her home, offered to help LaTasha. The woman is a Certified Personal Trainer

LaTasha is quick to remind people who hear her testimony that God did not just preach to people, but he met their needs. The big question now is

the impact this kindness has had in LaTasha's life. When she discusses the experience, tears well in her eye. "I have increased faith. God really does see us. He even knows the small things we do not verbalize. He blessed me because of my obedience. It goes to show that God is alive and cares about us. I can't wait for the opportunity to bless someone else." LaTasha's experience shows what can transpire by the power of God's promise and generous hearts.

There are needs in every church. On a recent Sunday here at Highline, I saw someone "slip" groceries in a sack to a person. Few words were exchanged...the sack was just quietly laid before the person. The giver quickly walked by. Vow to be super observant and you just may discover someone needs *your* help.

There are people in every church who are one paycheck from being homeless. If not today, they may be tomorrow. Suddenly, there is a family emergency and people are overwhelmed with horrendous medical bills. A person who is employed today can be unemployed tomorrow. Today, the marriage seems intact, yet tomorrow there is a spouse somewhere, who will announce he or she wants a divorce. The person sitting next to you in church may be one of many domestic violence victims. They do not "look" a particular way, nor does this only happen to a select group. There are just life experiences which we cannot always anticipate.

As for Latasha, she insists she told absolutely no one she was short of rent money. Nor to her knowledge, had anyone told the church her sons wanted a basketball for the courts at their home. She kept the dream of having a personal trainer to herself, because after all, that would be incredibly expensive. LaTasha has great reason these days to feel humbled and loved.

God delivered LaTasha's message and need to His faithful servants and they stepped up to the plate. When LaTasha later saw the pastor that evening, he remarked, "If anyone ever asks you if God speaks, you tell them this." He pulled a check out of his pocket. Latasha needed \$435.00. She looked down at the check which was written for \$436.61.

It is not a coincidence and certainly not a surprise. It is just how God works.
