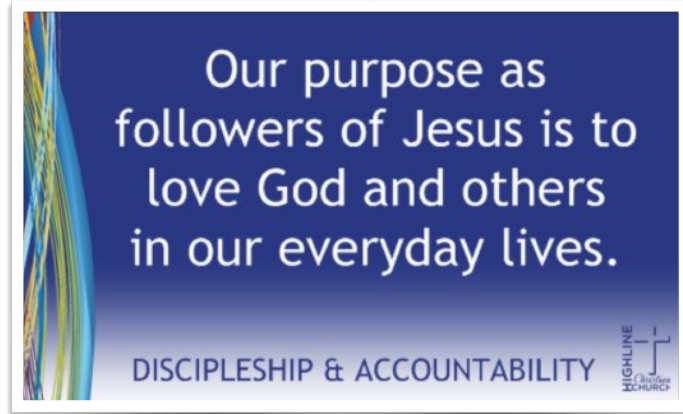

Resting in the Cross

What would your life be like if you didn't have to worry about sin?

It's a strange question, one that can cause quite a bit of debate, but also one that could lead to the hope of something more. In the Apprentice Series we recently studied the chapter in *The Good and Beautiful You* on "You are Forgiven". Now, as disciples of Jesus, seeking to put on Jesus' easy yoke and follow Him, one would think that we already know we are forgiven. Well, I believe we do, and yet there are many of us who continue to go to God to confess our sins and ask for forgiveness again and again. Unfortunately, many of us, myself included, still get caught up in what James Bryan Smith calls the sin - confess - forgiveness cycle, and I believe it causes us to miss and shortchange the wonder and the power of Jesus' loving act on the cross.

Resting in the Cross ***(Continued)***

Jesus willingly laid down His life on the cross (Jn. 10:17-18) to redeem God's children out of slavery to sin once and for all (Hebrews 7:27). In Jesus, we have been freed from the sacrificial system and from the cycle of sin, confess, forgiveness: we can now live full in a forgiven life. *"God is no longer dealing with us on the basis of our sins!"* (Dallas Willard) This is a huge concept, and deserves some thought on what it means for how we live in God's Kingdom today.

This is good news, really good news. We no longer need to return to the vicious cycle of sin, confess, forgiveness because we are already completely forgiven of all our sin; past, present, and future. Now, when we sin, we can repentantly come to Jesus and seek His help to continue the transformation of our minds and hearts to His mind and heart which is repentance. And, because we are already forgiven, we do not need to continue fearing if we are forgiven or not, rather we get to run into the loving arms of the Father who is running toward His child with a reckless love.

This month we are in the Christian season of Lent. Lent is a time of listening and preparing our hearts and lives to celebrate the wonder of God's incomprehensible love for us. It is a season of examining who we are, how

we are living, and opening ourselves up to the gentle whisper of Holy Spirit in order to draw nearer to our Savior. In the season of Lent we lay down our lives once again with Jesus in order that just as we celebrate Jesus being raised from the dead we may celebrate our life in Him.

How will you prepare to celebrate the passion of Jesus? There are many tools to help you prepare your heart during the season of Lent including books, blogs, Dwell (available via the HCC app), and others. One way you might prepare during this season would be to spend intentional time each day in the presence of a cross, reflecting on how you would live if you truly believed God was no longer dealing with you on the basis of your sin. *"Until you rest in the finality of the cross, you will never experience the reality of the resurrection."* (Bob George)

May you come to find rest in the cross and new life and freedom in Jesus this season.

While at camp there's a noticeable, positive transformation in the spirit of students. Many are more willing to be transparent when talking about God and their spiritual walk. There is often a confessed renewed desire to be in God's Word and to continue to experience the nearness to God that is tangible during a weekend of camp.



We took over 55 teens and 20 volunteer adult leaders who were all welcomed by the Pleasant Valley Christian Camp Staff. The retreat was full of plenty of activities for the students to be active and socialize throughout the weekend including: organized group hikes, hiding-go-seek, friendship bracelet making, axe and knife throwing, board games, and free time where the students had time to enjoy the beautiful nature around them and enjoy snacks from the snack shack.



Pleasant Valley Christian Camp exists to "present the Gospel of Jesus Christ and to promote a healthy recreational program in a Christian atmosphere." The unique fun that happens during a weekend of camp is undoubtedly challenging to duplicate. There is always something that changes in the hearts of students as they experience God's beautiful creation around them.



A greater openness to God is experienced during the daily "Devotional time," where students dig into the Scriptures for themselves. His truth is discussed during the follow-up time in small groups where they share what they learned from their study. God's love is displayed as the staff and adult leaders sacrifice their time and energy for the students. It is no coincidence that by the end of a camp weekend, the truth of God and the love of God leads to transformed lives.

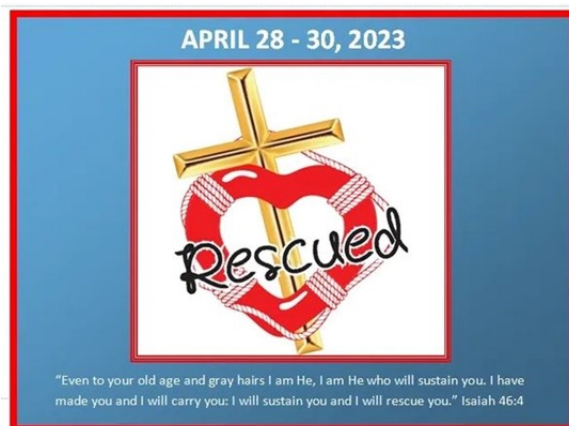


Nex Gen Kids Save the Dates!

Operation Christmas Child

Thank you for any donations you have been able to purchase early for the Operation Christmas Child boxes that will be packed next fall. Any donations that aren't for your own box can be dropped off in the OCC tote in the south building Community Room.

The **FOCUS** for **MARCH** donations is **TOOTHBRUSHES!**

There are many hygiene items that are acceptable and beneficial to put inside an Operation Christmas Child box: hairbrush, comb, nonbreakable mirror, dental floss or flossers, stick deodorant, colorful bandages, reusable cup/sippy cup, chapstick, nail clipper, nail file, washable/reusable cloth menstrual pads. We focus on four hygiene items to put in **EVERY BOX: Toothbrushes (March Focus)**, Wash Cloths and Bar Soap (July Focus), and Flashlights and Batteries (August Focus). We need to collect about 150 packages of Toothbrushes. A two-pack or three-pack of toothbrushes is placed in one box because the extra brush(es) can be used by other family members. Larger packages that are combined with a toothbrush holder are separated so that each brush/holder combo goes inside a different box. Please remember that while **toothbrushes** are a needed item, toothpaste **CAN NOT** be sent. It was found that some children were eating it like candy. 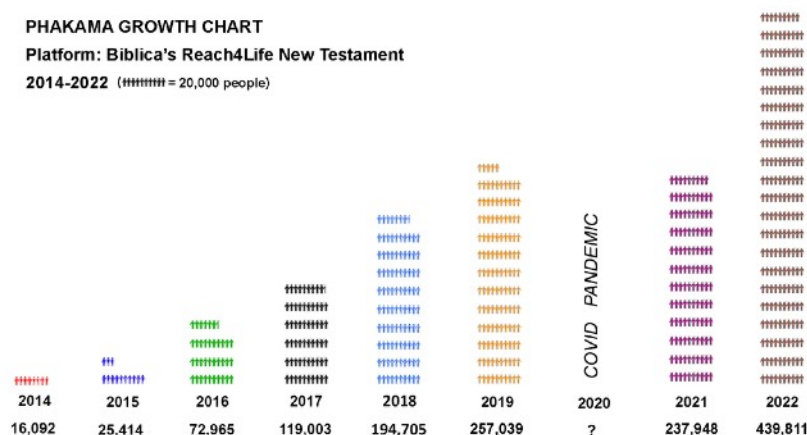


Prevention Time (Reach4Life) 2022 Results!

Doors were open again after Covid-19 lockdowns and Phakama (the South African nonprofit fully funded by Prevention Time, and led by Thandeka Nzama) took full advantage of it! Check out the growth chart above. Each little person icon now represents 2,000 people, to make 2022 fit on the page. In spite of problems such as the continued deterioration of the electrical grid, your generous contributions helped achieve these accomplishments:

- **439,811 people participated** in R4L groups - mostly in school assemblies but also in school classrooms, community groups, churches, rehabs, clinics, etc. This is up from 237,948 in 2021.
- **30,308 inmates** attended R4L groups, up from 2,064 in 2021 (due to closed facilities).
- **634 Peer Educators** taught the Reach4Life program, up from 492 in 2021.
- **70,647 R4L Bibles** were distributed.
- **8 radio stations** broadcast R4L, with a listening audience of 1,088,600, up from 5 radio stations with a listening audience of 687,675 in 2021.
- **734 pastors** were trained in South Africa and Swaziland, up from 638 in 2021.
- **The Soweto office was expanded** to create a room for rehab support groups.
- **A new church building in Tugela Ferry** has been fully funded and will be built in 2023. (This is the second church that has been built; the Harrismith church was built in 2021.)
- **R4L began in five new countries** – Zimbabwe, Uganda, Kenya, Tanzania, and Nigeria. A total of 10,136 people participated in these new countries.

Thank you for donating to Transform Burien. Because of your generous donations and the amazing work of over 100 volunteers, we were able to provide practical and spiritual help to many of our neighbors experiencing homelessness and poverty this year - and still end the year in the black. Many of our participating churches, and VFW #4314, and the Krull family (of the Thanksgiving Turkey Dinner or Pardon food drive) held drives to stock our food and clothing banks. Corporate donors Union Gospel Mission, Darigold, Outdoor Research, Big Lots, La Costa, Lavish Roots, Safeway, Feeding Feasible Feast, KFC, and HMS also donated many truckloads of products to us.


2022 was our second full year serving our community out of our expanded new site at the former Sunnydale Elementary School. Our clientele currently includes many low-income families of various nationalities who live in the neighboring apartments buildings. Some of our volunteers have been learning Spanish and other languages in order to better minister to these new friends. This year we added services from the King County Mobile Veterinary Clinic hosted once a month, a drive through hand-out of fresh produce and dairy products every Friday, and periodic visits from the UGM shower van, barbers, King County nurses who administer vaccines, and A1 Lifeline who provide free cell phones. We are thankful for the chance to build relationships and share Christ's love with our new clients, as well as business and government partners.

We are sad to report that Charlotte Berg, who ran our Clothing Closet for many years went to be with the Lord in July. Transform's board, volunteers, and clients miss her very much. Our clothing intake room has been named "Charlotte's Closet" in honor of her. In 2021, Charlotte and her husband Don were named Citizens of the Year by the Burien City Council for the work they did at Transform and in the Burien Community.

We were able to provide the following services in 2022:

- Weekly Lunch and Dinner Meals: 13,208 hot meals served
- Weekly Bible Study Breakfast: 520 hot breakfasts served
- Sack Lunches: 4,160 sack lunches handed out
- Food Bank: 4,119 client visits, with each client receiving 1 or 2 full bags of food
- Clothing Bank: Approximately 3,858 client visits, with each client receiving 1 or 2 bags of clothing and hygiene supplies
- Community Curbside Produce: approximately 160 boxes of produce, dairy, and other groceries given away via drive-through service each week

- Veterinary Clinic Visits through the King County Services: A mobile veterinary van gives care to our guests and their pets on-site once a month on Wednesday
- Christmas gift bags: 150 bags with new gloves, hats, socks, toiletries, and candy were provided to our neighbors in need over Christmas
