

A couple of years ago my family went camping with a number of other families from our homeschool co-op. I'm actually pretty reserved and much prefer to be the wall flower standing on the side watching everything and everyone go by and do their thing. Now, there are moments when I come out of my shell and enter the fun, if you've had the opportunity to partner with me at a children's ministry event in the past you may have some idea of what I'm talking about. I do this song at campfire that usually ends up with most everyone laughing instead of singing along. Well, at our co-op most of the students and parents know who I am, but the Bret that they know is the quiet and observant Bret. For the campout talent show our family decided we would sing Boom-chick-a-boom. I started the song with the first verse, then one of my

Following the campfire I had people, kids and parents alike, coming to me and saying how great it was and how they never knew I had that kind of thing in me.

At Highline we are becoming a "Church OF Groups." This means that from the elders to the nursery workers, from the greeters to the finance team and every other group in between and around seek to enter into group life to encourage each other to become more like Jesus.

<u>Group Life</u> - Highly relational environments for life transformation to Christlikeness through growth, life, and service.

This way of life in Church is very different from most other church environments as well as how we have functioned at Highline in the past. Every one of us are having to refocus and relearn why we gather together in some form of group. As we grow to become a Church OF Groups we need to continue to shift our mindset from what groups like: Sunday School Classes, Bible Studies, and Home Groups used to do, to the highly relational environments we are seeking

to create for the sake of discipleship to Jesus.

Pastor Tim has said a number of times "Our faith is *personal* but it is not private." It is true we all come to Jesus in our own way, and we are all on our own personal journey toward Christ being formed in us, but what God accomplishes in us in our journey is never only for us, it is for the Body as a whole. The Apostle Paul speaks to this some when he wrote to the Ephesians in Ephesians 4:17ff. Paul highlights the necessary transformation in our lives, our need to "put off your old self, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness." How does this transformation take place and what difference does it make to others? Good questions, and Paul went on to describe the environment for both transformation and experience. Our transformation best takes place in the environment of community; communities where we can be vulnerable with one another and where we can all be seen, known, and loved to Christlikeness. As we grow in communities of Christlikeness we will also grow as communities of light, love, forgiveness, grace, and truth for the world to see and to come to know the love of Jesus that surpasses all understanding.

What does Boom-chick-a-boom have to do with church of groups? I had a relationship with many of the students

# Men by God

#### **FACING YOUR TRIALS**

Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds. James 1:2

What was it like for James growing up with a big brother who never did anything wrong? It must have been difficult. The Holy Spirit may have inspired James to write these words about genuine biblical joy by recalling some of these childhood trials. Childhood is inherently traumatic. Boys with an absent father live through serial disappointments. Traumatic losses take their toll. As adult men, how do we deal with episodic and unexpected events? When we are anxious, depressed, fearful, or angry is the root cause a neuro-chemical synapse gone haywire? Is the cure found in pharmaceuticals?

What does the Bible say? Be angry, and do not sin; ponder in your own hearts on your beds, and be silent. Psalm 4:4

The source of our undesirable emotions is not our brains, but our souls. Having the indwelling Holy Spirit present with your spirit is just the beginning of a new life. Go ahead and be angry and express deep emotions in response to your trials. Make it a prayer to the only one who hears and can give you the solution. Learn by reading and meditating on the God's Word. Learn what it means to embrace your trials instead of hating them.

We generally gravitate to what seems right which often does not match with reality. If you are married, pay attention to your wife's countenance at the time you speak to her. If you don't like what you see, could there have been any anger in your thoughts prior to those words? Fear of failure could be the bitter root of anxiety which leads to unhappiness which leads to anger. "Fear not" was a common greeting by Jesus to his disciples in the Gospels. Biblical joy is much more than the fleeting temporal happiness we feel when good things happen (like when our sports team wins).

# Thoughts from "Experiencing God"

# Knowing and Doing the Will of God. (Henry T. Blackaby and Claude V. King)

In the later years of our lives, it gets easier to want to sit back and, well, just let life happen. The efforts of the everyday administrations take up more and more of our time. We are tempted to think the years of our usefulness are over. As Christians God would like us to remember that His plan for our lives includes the here and now. "God is always at work around you." God wants us to recognize the activity of God around us and adjust our lives to join Him. Jesus said, "My Father is always at His work to this very day, and I too, am working. I tell you the truth, the Son can do nothing by himself; he can do only what he sees his Father doing because whatever the Father does the Son also does. For the Father loves the Son and shows him all he does. Yes, to your amazement he will show him even greater things than these." John 5:17, 19-20.

"The Holy Spirit and the Word of God will instruct you and help you know when and where God is working. Once you know where He is working.....adjust your life to join Him." Adjusting gets a little harder as life goes on. God never intended us to do His work under our own power. The Apostle Paul was no spring chicken. His body had been abused and he had some kind of permanent disability, yet he determined to press on. To the Corinthians he wrote, "I came to you in weakness and fear, and with

much trembling. My message and my preaching were not with wise and persuasive words, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, so that your faith might not rest on men's wisdom, but on God's power." 1 Cor.2:3-5.

Our response to God depends on our relationship to God. God desires a love relationship with His people. The more we get to know Him, the better we will recognize when He is speaking. In the Old Testament accounts God used various means to speak to His servants and give instructions. To Moses He spoke though the supernatural burning bush. To Abram there was a clear call to "Go to a land I will show you." To David, God sent His servant Samuel to anoint David King of Israel. "When God spoke, they knew it was God. They knew what God was saying. They knew what they were to do in response." As we open God's Word, commune with Him through prayer and seek to know Him, we will more clearly recognize when He is speaking to our hearts. His instructions often come one step at a time. We don't need to know the whole plan, only the first step He has given us. At that point we must decide, "Am I willing to adjust my life to take this first step even though I don't know where it will lead? Can I trust that God has a plan and has invited me to join Him in what He is about to do?"

"An ordinary person is who God most likes to use. Paul said God deliberately seeks out

the weak thing and the despised thing because it is from them that He can receive the greatest glory. Then everyone will know that only God could have done it. If you feel weak, limited, ordinary, you are the best material through which God can work." Ask God to reveal what He is about to do. The revelation is an invitation for you to join Him. To do that you must adjust your life, leave your comfort zone. In His hands our ordinary life can be used for the extraordinary.

"Elijah was a man just like us. He prayed earnestly that it would not rain, and it did not rain on the land for three and a half years. Again he prayed, and the heavens gave rain, and the earth produced its crops." James 5:17 & 18.

Elijah's faith grew as he grew in his relationship with the LORD. It was a step-by-step journey. When God spoke, Elijah obeyed. He didn't often know the next step. He simply did the one thing he had been instructed to do. In his obedience he was provided for in famine, given power to raised the dead son of his hostess, face a king who had issued a death warrant on his life, and confronted the 450 prophets of Baal, the 400 prophets of the Asherah, "who eat at Jezebels' table." I Kings 17 & 18.

Elijah came to know God by experience as he obeyed Him and God accomplished His work through him. See 1 Kings 17.

What one thing might the LORD be laying on your heart to do for Him in this day? That one thing may require you to adjust your plans. When God calls us to a task, He gives us all we need to accomplish that task. One day at a time we deepen our relationship with the Living LORD who is able to do exceedingly, abundantly more than we ask or can even imagine. Ephesians 3:20.

### Items That Can't Be Included in Boxes:

Candy (or anything edible), toothpaste, gum, used items, damaged items, scary items, warrelated items, liquids, lotions, liquid glue (glue sticks & short blunt tip scissors are ok), shampoo, medications or vitamins, bubbles, breakable items, glass containers, aerosol cans

#### **Steps to Filling a Shoebox:**

- 3. Label a Box (choose M/F & age 2-4, 5-9, 10-14)
  - 4. Pay for a Box (see insert)
    - 5. Return the Box
    - 6. Pray for Your Box

#### **Individual Items Being Collected/Ideas for Boxes:**

Toothbrushes, Socks, Toys such as balls, playdoh, toy instruments, card games, craft kits/supplies, jump ropes, toy cars, calculators, play jewelry, Etch-a-Sketch, gardening tools/gloves, tool sets, binoculars, toys w/buttons or noises; Wow items such as soccer balls & pumps, battery radio, shoes, Stuffed Animals or small dolls, Flashlights with batteries, Wash Cloths, Bar Soap (in ziplock bag), School Supplies such as backpacks, notebooks, pencils, pink erasers, pencil sharpeners, crayons, markers, colored pencils

#### **Payment Options**

It costs **\$10** to ship each shoebox. That shipping cost can be paid in any of the following ways, however online is preferred:

- \*\* Mail your shipping donation to Samaritan's Purse, PO Box 3000, Boone NC, 28607-9956
- \*\* Place a check, payable to Samaritan's Purse (with OCC on the memo line) IN your box on TOP of the items. One check for multiple boxes CAN be put inside one box. Cash is allowed, but is the least preferred choice.
